Background: On July 31, 2015, the City of Hiawatha submitted to the Public Works Department an application for street name changes for Miller Road NE to Edgewood Road NE from the Hiawatha City Limit to Tower Terrace Road NE, a distance of approximately 5,100 feet; and renaming Loggerhead Road NE from Tower Terrace Road NE to the North City Limit, a distance of approximately 1,300 feet. Per the requirements of City Ordinance No. 073-02, Section 33D.07.3 (c) of the Municipal Code (Procedures for Renaming Existing Streets), a public hearing will be held at City Council after receipt of the petition to rename a street. Per Section 33D.07.3. (d), the application, including any written or public comment from the public hearing, will then be forwarded to the Development Services Department for review and comment.

The proposed name of Edgewood Road NE was chosen because of plans to extend existing Edgewood Road NE to Boyson Road, in accordance with the Connections 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan.

On September 8, 2015, a notice for a public hearing was approved by City Council. In further discussion with Kim Downs, City Administrator for the City of Hiawatha, on September 17, 2015, it was agreed upon that the street name change for Miller Road NE from Tower Terrace Road NE southerly to the Hiawatha City Limits does not need to be changed to Edgewood Road NE, as it does not follow the proposed future alignment of Edgewood Road NE and would likely need to be renamed again after the Edgewood Road extension is built. Therefore, Miller Road NE within the City of Cedar Rapids City Limits is not being recommended to be changed to Edgewood Road NE at this time. The City of Hiawatha still plans to change the name of Miller Road NE within their city limits (from Boyson Road northerly to the curve north of Grey Wolf Drive), as this section does follow the proposed alignment of the Edgewood Road extension.

Action/Recommendation: The Public Works Department recommends discussing this request and providing public comment and any City Council recommendations to the City Development Services Department for review prior to further City Council consideration of the street name change request.

Alternative Recommendation: This item may be tabled and Hiawatha notified of the schedule delay.

Time Sensitivity: The public hearing must take place on September 22, 2015 to maintain the schedule proposed by the City of Hiawatha.

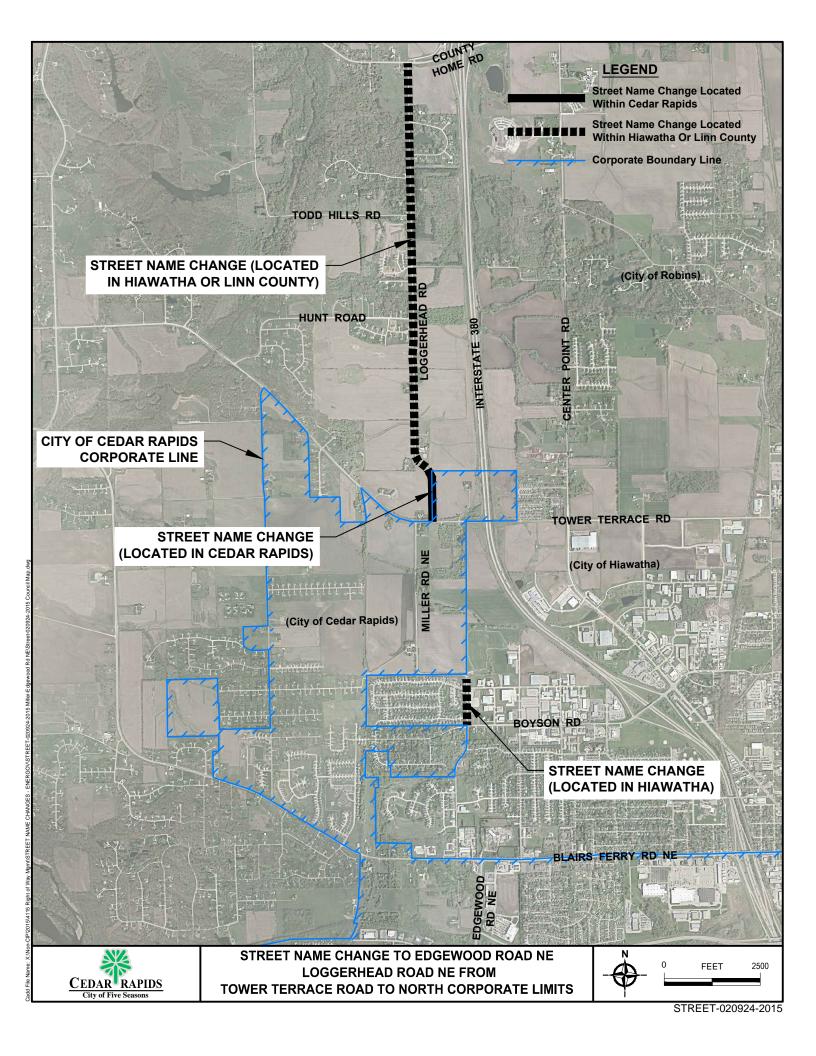

The Application is then reviewed by appropriate City departments and a determination made that the improvements located in and are in conformance with this Plan, and that the improvements made increased the actual assessed valuation of the property by at least the minimum percentage required under the Urban Revitalization Act, and the improvements were made during the time the area was designated as a Revitalization Area. 8.2 Tax Exemption Schedules

8.2.1 Schedule 1 - Residential Exemption:

8.2.3 Schedule 3 - Three Year Exemptions:

All qualified real estate assessed as residential property or assessed as commercial property, if the commercial property consists of three or more separate living quarters with at least seventy-five percent of the space used for residential purposes, is eligible to receive a one hundred percent exemption from taxation on the actual value added by the improvements. The exemption is for a period of ten years.

8.2.5 Election of Schedule:

The property owner of qualified real estate eligible for an exemption shall elect to use one of the schedules identified above. Once the election of schedule has been made and the exemption granted, the property owner is not permitted to change the exemption schedule.

8.3 Definitions

- (a) "Qualified Business or Other Non-Residential Tenant" shall mean the legal occupant of a building or part thereof and conducting a business or non-residential operation which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same premises continuously since one year prior to the adoption of this Plan.
- (b) "Qualified Real Estate" shall mean real property, other than land, which is located in this Revitalization Area and to which improvements have been added during the time of the area was so designated, which have increased the actual value by at least fifteen percent (15%) or at least ten percent (10%), in the case of land upon which is located more than one building (and not assessed as residential property) increased the actual value of the buildings to which the improvements have been made.

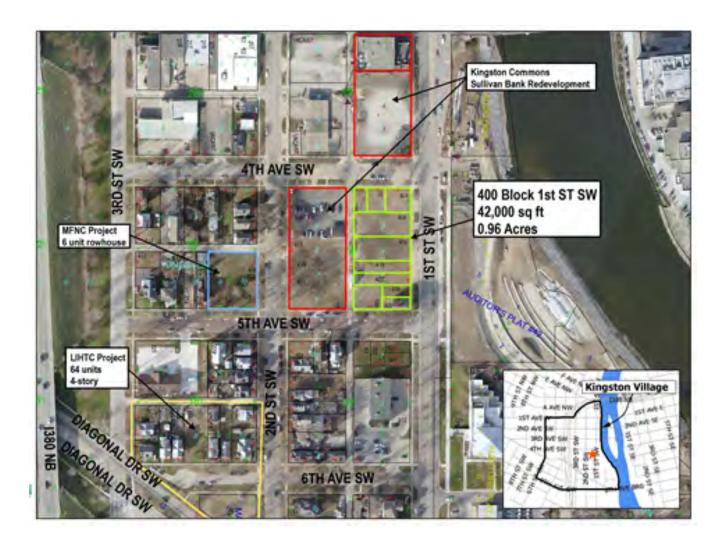

8.2.1 Schedule 1 - Residential Exemption:

All qualified real estate assessed as residential property is eligible to receive an exemption from taxation based on the actual value added by the improvements, determined as follows: One hundred fifteen percent of the value added by the improvements. However, the amount of the actual value added by the improvements which shall be used to compute the exemption shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars and the granting of the exemption shall not result in the actual value of the qualified real estate being reduced below the actual value on which the homestead credit is computed under § 425.1.

8.2.2 Schedule 2 - Ten Year Declining Exemption:

All qualified real estate is eligible to receive a portion exemption from taxation on the actual value added by the improvements for a 10-year period. The amount of the partial exemption is equal to a percentage of the property taxes generated by the actual value added by those improvements as follows:

8.2.3 Schedule 3 - Three Year Exemptions:

All qualified real estate is eligible to receive a one hundred percent (100%) exemption from taxation on the actual value added by qualified improvements for three years.

8.2.4 Schedule 4 - 10-Year Qualified Residential Exemption:

All qualified real estate assessed as residential property or assessed as commercial property, if the commercial property consists of three or more separate living quarters with at least seventy-five percent of the space used for residential purposes, is eligible to receive a one hundred percent exemption from taxation on the actual value added by the improvements. The exemption is for a period of ten years.

8.2.5 Election of Schedule:

The property owner of qualified real estate eligible for an exemption shall elect to use one of the schedules identified above. Once the election of

schedule has been made and the exemption granted, the property owner is not permitted to change the exemption schedule.

8.3 Definitions

- (a) "Qualified Business or Other Non-Residential Tenant" shall mean the legal occupant of a building or part thereof and conducting a business or non-residential operation which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same premises continuously since one year prior to the adoption of this Plan.
- (b) "Qualified Real Estate" shall mean real property, other than land, which is located in this Revitalization Area and to which improvements have been added during the time of the area was so designated, which have increased the actual value by at least fifteen percent (15%) or at least ten percent (10%), in the case of land upon which is located more than one building (and not assessed as residential property) increased the actual value of the buildings to which the improvements have been made.

"Qualified Real Estate" also means land upon which no structure existed at the start of new construction, which is located in this Revitalization Area and upon which new construction has been added during the time the area was designated as a Revitalization Area.

(c) "Improvements" includes rehabilitation and additions to existing structures as well as new construction on vacant land or on land with existing structures.

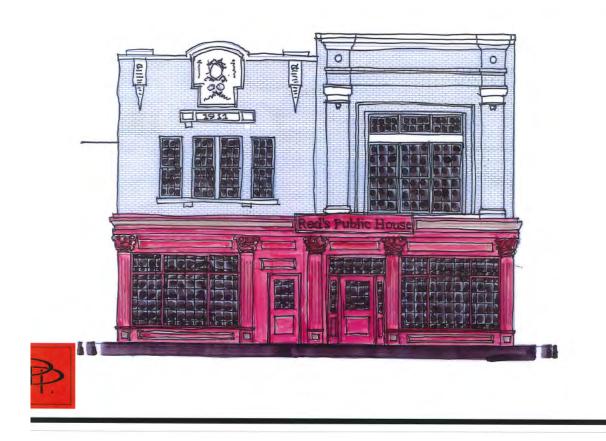

The administrative plan further directs staff to use lots acquired by the City through the Voluntary Property Acquisition Program to be conveyed to the developer in consideration for the construction of the Single Family New Construction unit.

These properties have been identified by developers and City staff and meet the program criteria required to house a Single Family New Construction unit. A total of 202 properties have been identified by 28 developers in the current phase of property allocation for this program. EnvisionCR Element/Goal: GrowCR Goal 3: Connect growing areas to existing neighborhoods.

Background: MedQuarter has requested reducing truck traffic through the MedQuarter District, primarily on 10th Street SE. The City hired Anderson-Bogert Engineers and Surveyors to evaluate impacts associated with redistributing through truck traffic on 7th Street, 8th Street and 10th Street SE. The study found 10th Street SE averages 479 trucks per day, and estimated up to 200 could be moved to 7th Street/8th Street SE. The MedQuarter Commission supports Anderson-Bogert's conclusions from the study and the committee approved the alternative to redistribute truck traffic by designating 7th Street/8th Street SE as alternate routes to 10th Street SE.

The current limits for both 7th Street and 8th Street are from Interstate 380 to 1st Avenue East and then over to 10th Street SE, which goes through the MedQuarter. The revised limits would allow heavily laden vehicles to continue traveling down 7th Street or 8th Street to 8th Avenue SE.

Action/Recommendation: The Traffic Engineering Division of the Public Works Department recommends altering the limits to allow truck traffic on 7th Street and 8th Street SE from 1st Avenue E to 8th Avenue SE. 7th and 8th St NE/SE truck traffic limits will change from I-380 to 1st Avenue E, and from I-380 to 8th Avenue SE in order to balance the truck traffic through the MedQuarter District.

Alternative Recommendation: Should Council not approve the resolution, the limits allowing truck traffic on 7th Street and 8th Street NE/SE will remain from I-380 to 1st Avenue. E.

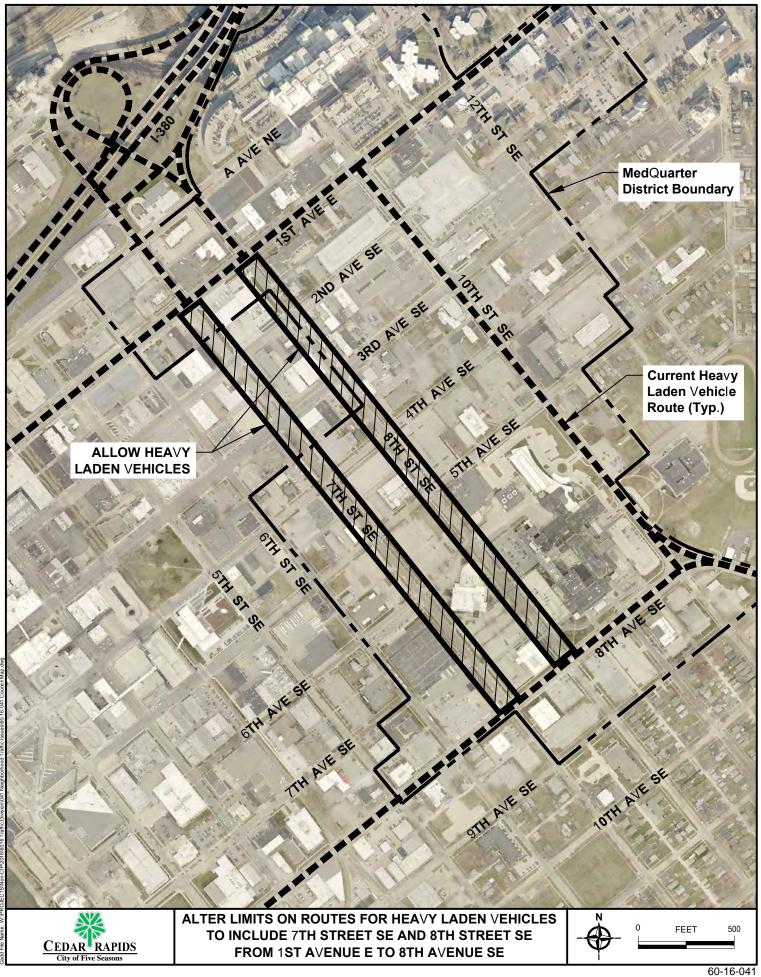

On November 9, 2010, by Resolution No. 1306-11-10 the City Council approved the Administrative Plan for the ROOTs Program. New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District.

EnvisionCR Element/Goal: StrengthenCR Goal 2: Improve the quality and identity of neighborhoods and key corridors.

Background:

The City received a petition requesting creation of a Self-Supporting Medical Improvement District (SSMID) on August 24, 2015 from a collection of property owners in the Czech Village-New Bohemia area (see attached map). The purpose of the proposed Czech Village-New Bohemia District shall be the following:

- The undertaking of actions and the design and construction of any and all improvements authorized by the Act;
- The performance of administration, redevelopment, and revitalization of the District, as authorized by the Act;
- Any and all of which actions and improvements are intended to benefit the property within the District.

The lowa Code requires that a petition to create or expand a SSMID district must be made by 25% of the property owners representing at least 25% of the assessed property value in the district. The petition for the creation of the Czech Village-New Bohemia SSMID was signed by owners of 60 of the 104 taxable parcels (57%) representing 62% of the assessed value for the proposed expansion area.

The petition states that if approved, the District will be created for a period of seven (7) years, commencing with a levy of taxes for collection in Fiscal Year 2017. After the seven (7) year period, the District may be renewed following the same petitioning process. During the lifetime of the District, properties within the proposed District boundary area will be taxed with a rate assessment not to exceed \$3 per thousand dollars of taxable valuation. The levy rate of \$3 is the maximum combined rate which may be used for debt service, capital improvements, or operations.

The creation of the SSMID will attract and retain jobs; enhance the regional reputation of the Czech Village-New Bohemia area through marketing and capital improvements; provide enhanced personal and property security, and manage parking. It is the expectation that property owners within the District will contribute to the maintenance of the improvements made by the City. As benefactors of the improvements, properties owners in the Czech Village-New Bohemia District will see property values increase over time, which will promote reinvestment in adjacent neighborhoods and contribute to enhancing the vibrancy in the area.

The City of Cedar Planning Commission reviewed the request and unanimously supported the SSMID on September 10, 2015. As such, the CPC recommends approval to City Council. Next steps in the process include the following:

A study of the J Avenue Water Treatment Plant was completed in the fall of 2011. The report detailed alternatives that would be beneficial for the longevity of the plant. These alternatives were reviewed and staged in a specific manner and over many years. This staging was done to both improve operational factors during the construction work and to minimize the effect of the cost on ratepayers. This Project is related to only the first phase (Phase 1) of a much larger improvements project. All of the work required is currently staged in five separate phases and spread out over ten years in total.

Phase I of this project generally includes replacement of the existing filter gallery piping, installation of new backwash supply pumps, rehabilitation of the flocculation basins, replacement of the re-carbonation basins with a piping header, and CO2 chemical feed improvements. CH2M Hill Engineers, Inc. was selected to provide design and construction administration services for the Phase 1 Improvements.

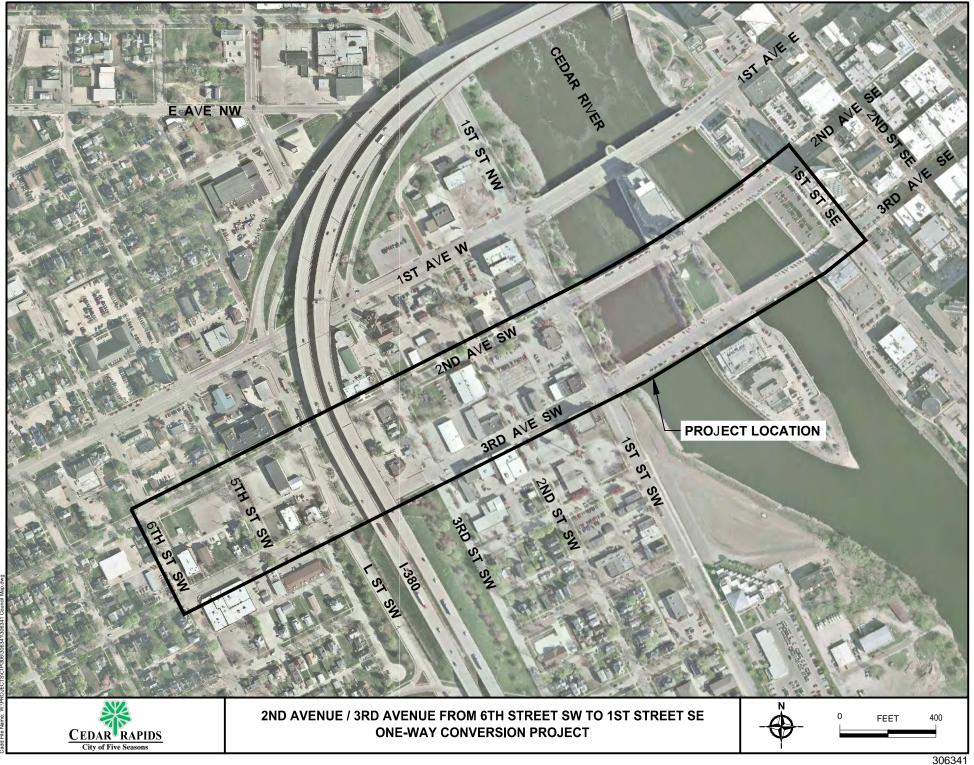

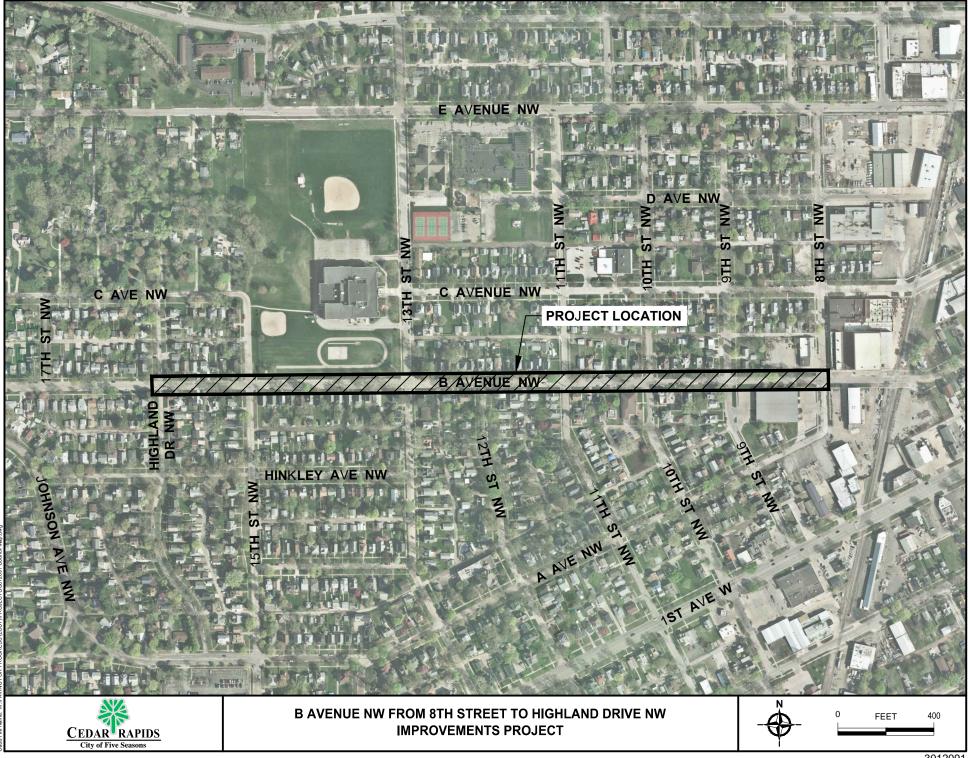

Background: The goal of the project is to construct improvements to specific electrical, HVAC, and architectural components of the Water Distribution Maintenance Building and the J Avenue Water Treatment Plant. The electrical portion of the project involves demolishing and replacing obsolete electrical installations in the J Avenue Water Plant and Water Distribution Maintenance Building and energizing the Water Distribution Maintenance Building from a different power source located on the J Avenue Water Plant site. 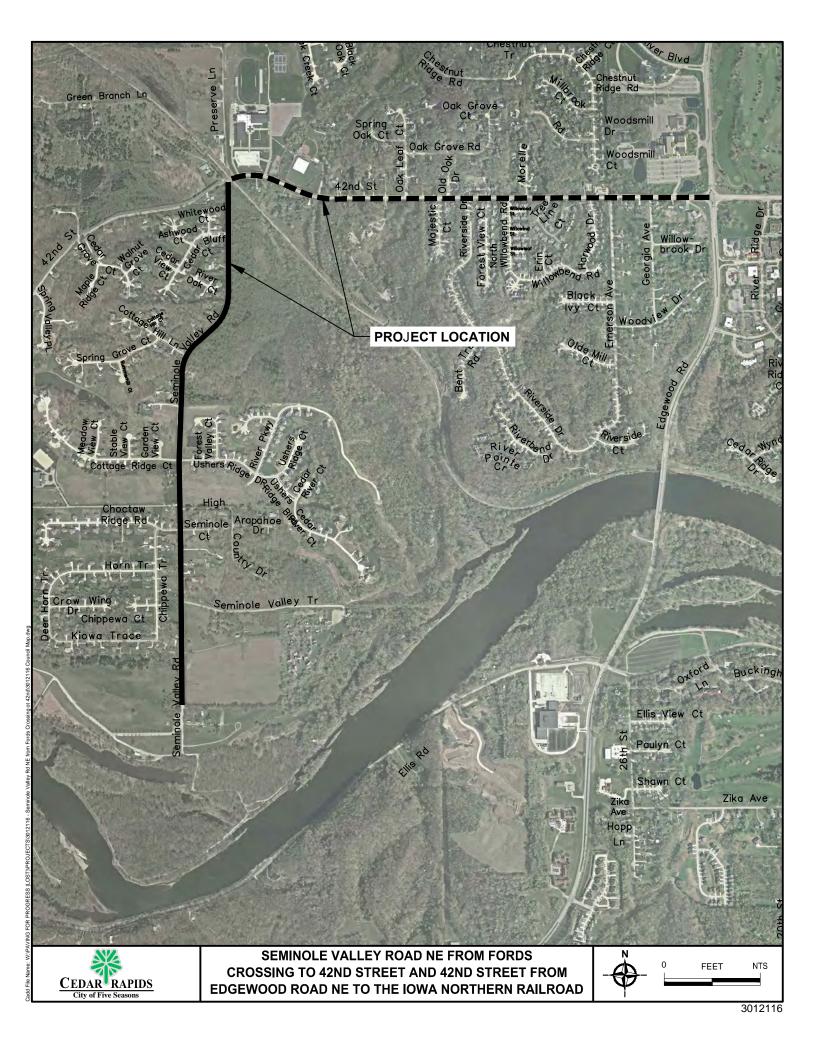

Background: The 34th Street SE Bridge at Spoon Creek has been in poor condition and has been recommended for replacement for a considerable time. Shoemaker & Haaland Professional Engineers was originally retained in August 2010, under CIP No. 305122, to design a replacement structure. At that time, it was determined a sanitary sewer under 34th Street SE, extending north to Cottage Grove Avenue SE, had to be replaced to accommodate a new structure. That project was then delayed because 34th Street SE was used as a detour for other projects.

Public Works Department staff now intends to proceed with bridge replacement. The original professional services agreement under CIP No. 305122 will be closed out and replaced with this agreement under CIP No. 304361. 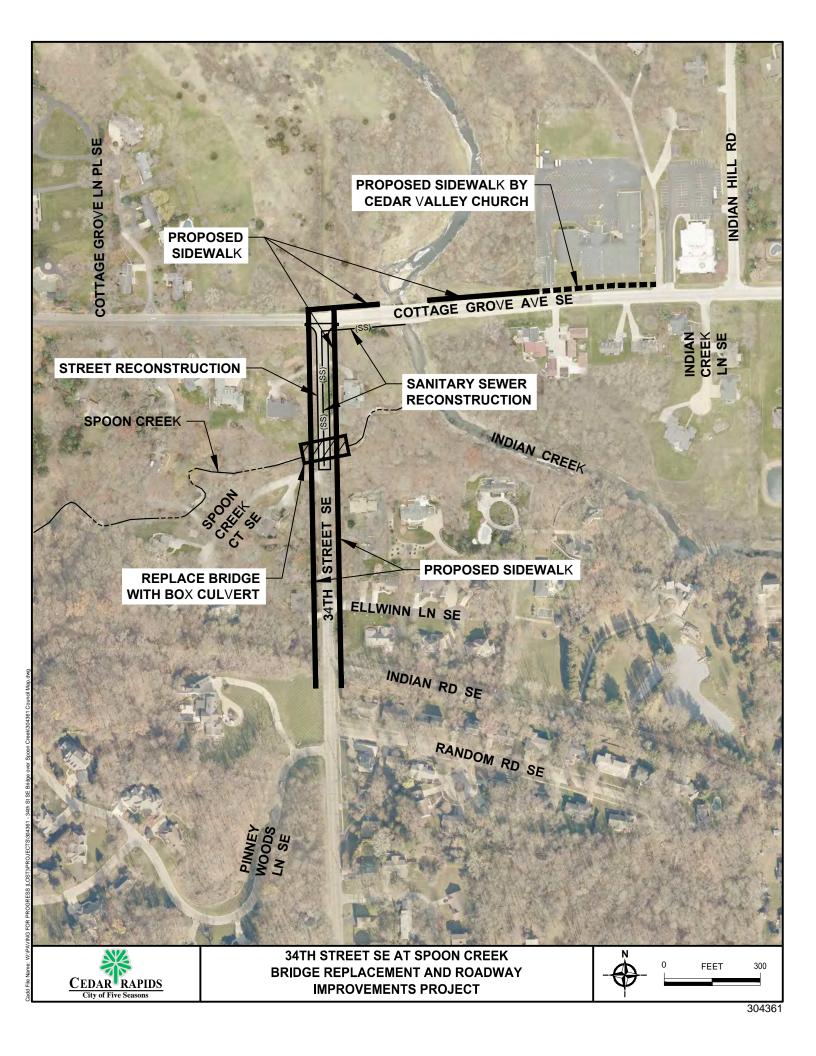

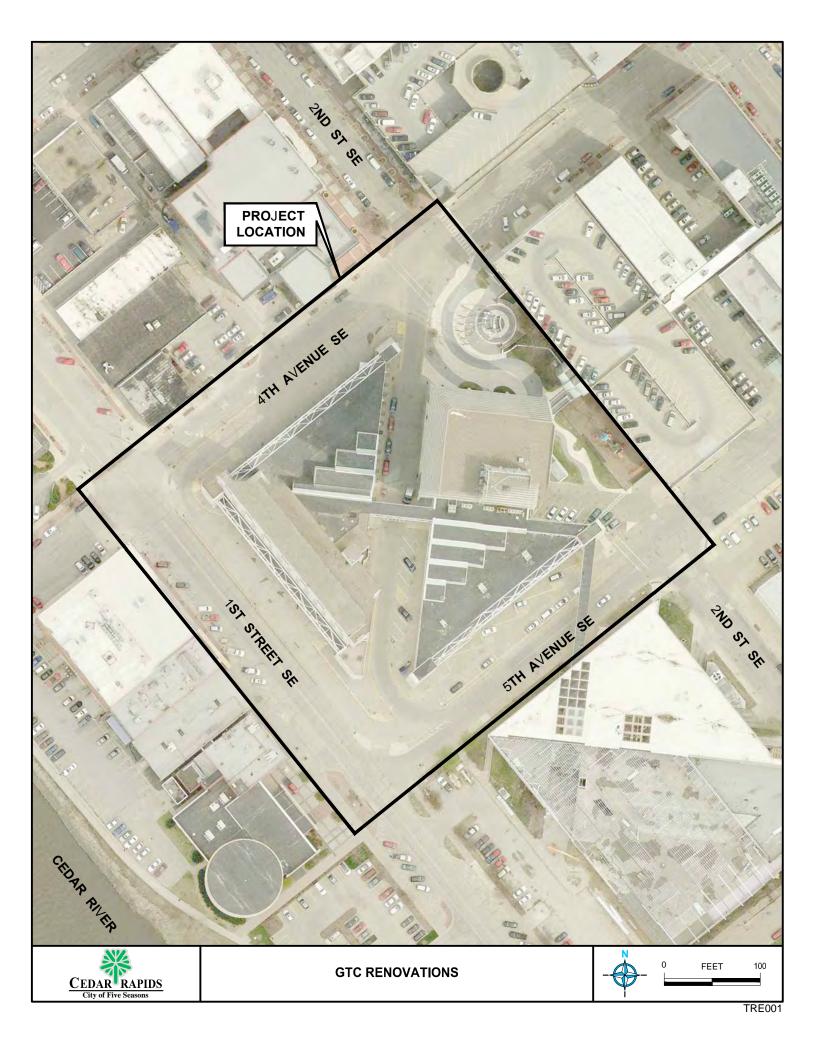

 - (v) To serve the community as a gathering place for festivals and events.

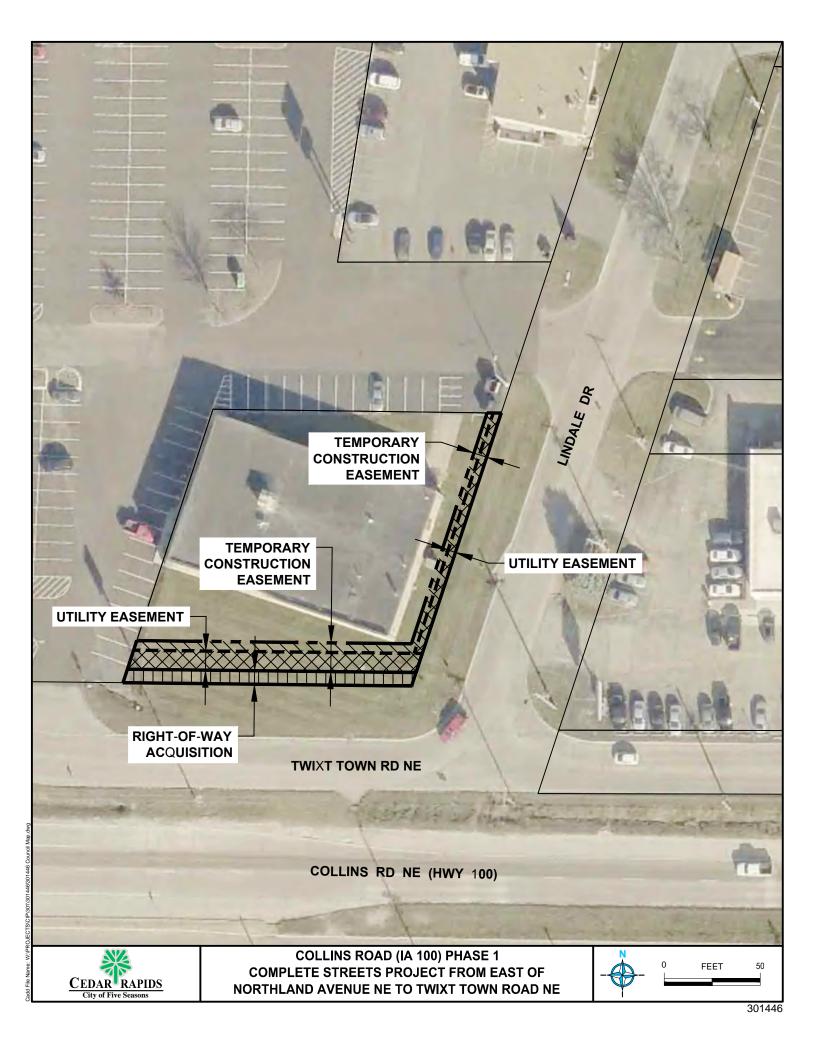

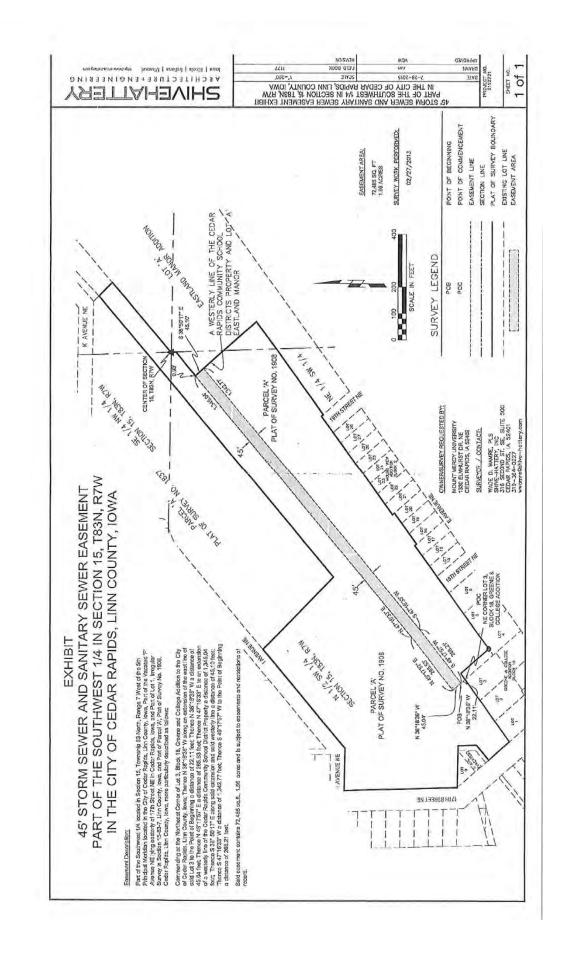

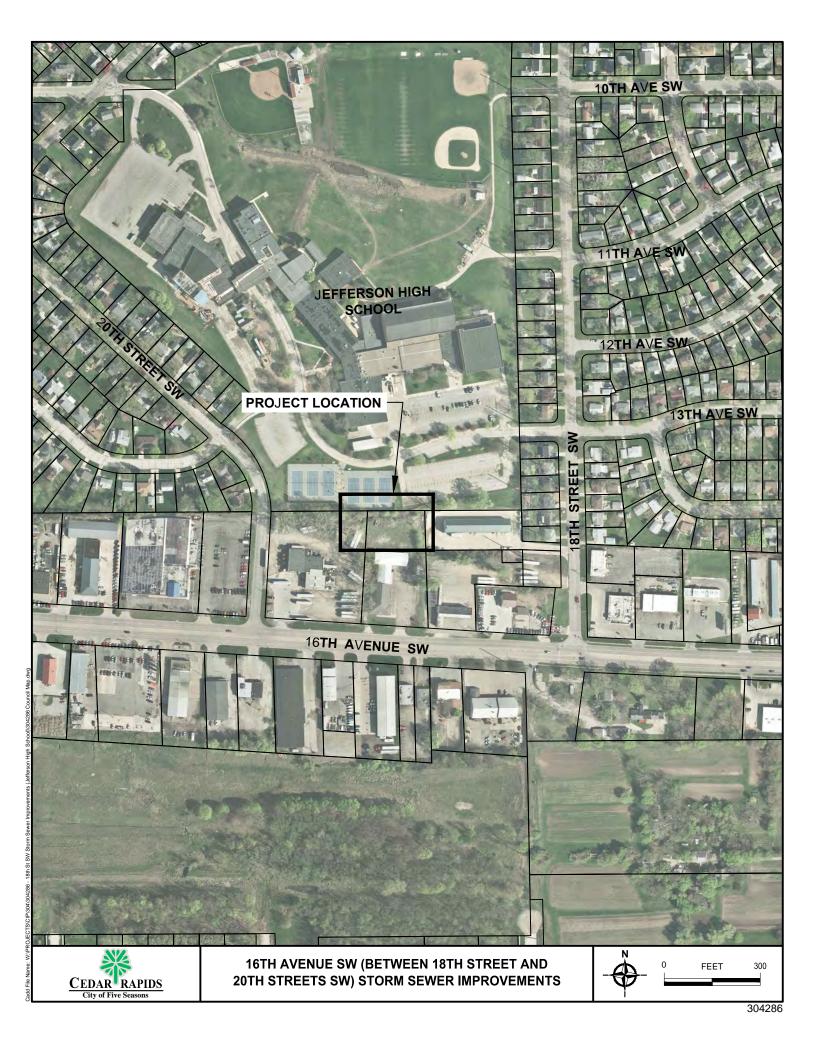

The North Ash Tank dates back to the original plant construction. In 2003, a new ash tank (South Ash Tank) was added and the North Ash Tank was taken out of service and abandoned in place. Due to the abrasive nature of the ash slurry, elements of the South Ash Tank have reached the end of their useful life and require repairs or replacement.

The goal of the project is to replace the North Ash Tank and associated appurtenances. Once the North Ash Tank has been replaced, repairs will be made to the South Ash Tank. 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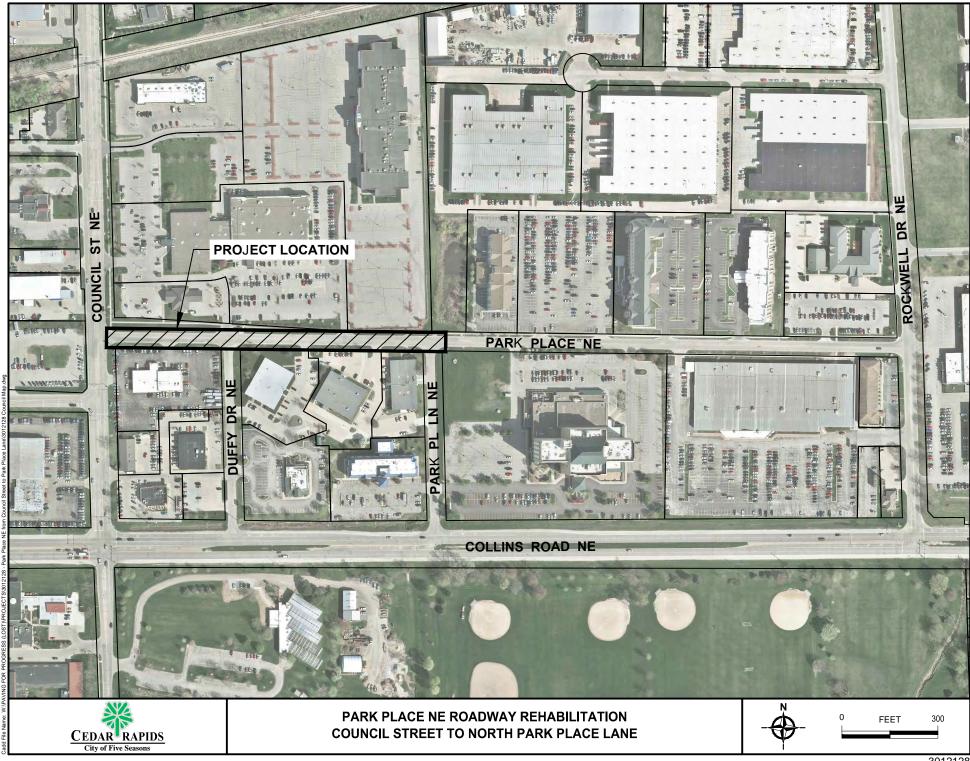

Resolution adopting the City of Cedar Rapids Historic Preservation Plan.

EnvisionCR Element/Goal: StrengthenCR Goal 2: Improve the quality and identity of neighborhoods and key corridors.

Background:

In August 2011, the City of Cedar Rapids entered into a memorandum of agreement (MOA) with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the State Historical Society of Iowa (SHPO), and the Iowa Homeland Security & Emergency Management Division (IHSEMD) regarding the demolition of historic properties that resulted from the 2008 flood. The MOA outlines eight mitigation measures to address the adverse impact on historic properties. One of these mitigation measures is the preparation of the City's first Historic Preservation Plan (Plan).

At the City Council's September 22, 2015 meeting the staff will be requesting that the Council adopt the Plan. On August 13, 2015, both the City Planning Commission and the Historic Preservation Commission unanimously recommended adoption of the Plan by the City Council.

Overview of Stakeholder Outreach:

Since April 2014, the City staff along with the consultant team reached out to a variety of stakeholders. As part of the development of the Plan, the following meetings, focus groups, and public events were held.

- Focus group meetings with historic preservation interest groups, health care, business, and development representatives (April 2014, September 2014)
- Public workshop (September 2014)
- Public open house (April 2015)
- Neighborhood Association meetings (June August 2015)
- Save CR Heritage meetings (May and September 2015)

Nearly 40 members of the public attended the public workshop held in September 2014. At this event participants responded to questions individually and collectively, which helped to inform the goals, policies, and initiatives in the Plan. At the open house held in April 2015, approximately 30 members of the public provided input on the initiatives outlined in the Plan.

In addition, the Historic Preservation Plan Task Force, consisting of representatives of the City Council, City Planning Commission, Historic Preservation Commission, Medical Self Supporting Municipal Improvement District, and City staff, met regularly and provided feedback and input on the Plan.

Plan Summary:

The Plan provides the vision and the policy direction for historic preservation within the city, and is a component of the City's comprehensive plan, EnvisionCR. It identifies the following five strategic components that make up the preservation program:

- *Administration:* The framework for operating the preservation program.
- Identification: The survey and recognition of properties with cultural or historic significance.
- Management Tools: The specific mechanisms for protecting historic properties.
- Incentives and Benefits: Programs that assist property owners and support preservation.
- Education: The tools to build awareness and strengthen skills to support preservation.

For each component, goals, policies, and initiatives are identified. Part 1 of the Plan discusses implementation and includes an initiatives matrix that outlines a schedule for when each initiative in the Plan will move forward. Some key initiatives include: 1) Incorporating historic preservation into Neighborhood Action Plans and Corridor Action Plans, planning study areas, and other City planning projects; 2) Updating Chapter 18 Historic Preservation of the Municipal Code; and 3) Updating the Guidelines for Cedar Rapids Historic Districts.

Action/Recommendation: City staff recommends approval of the resolution.

Said Ordinance was adopted by City Council on April 12-1995, which rezoned property at 605 Boyson Road NE from A, Agricultural Zone District to O-S, Office Service Zone District. A preliminary site development plan for this project was approved by the City Planning Commission on August 13, 2015.

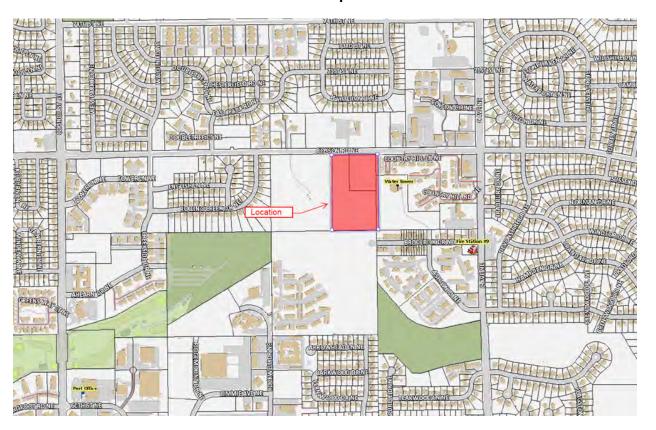
