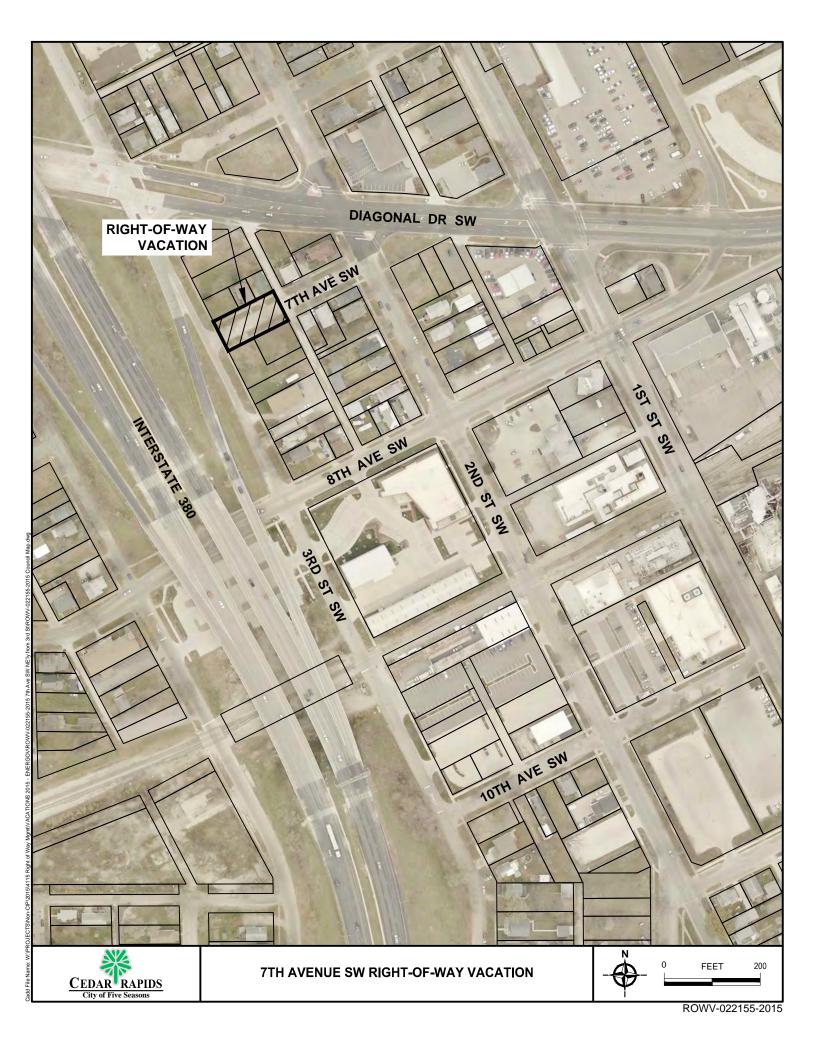

Background: The Upflow Anaerobic Sludge Blanket (UASB) Reactors at the Cedar Rapids WPCF are fabricated of stainless steel and covered with aluminum access panels supported by a fiberglass reinforced plastic (FRP) structure. FRP defects were previously observed and repaired in 2007 and 2008. The City took UASB Reactor No. 3 out of service in early April 2015 and hired HDR Engineering, Inc. to inspect the replacement FRP structures to ensure that they were withstanding the corrosive environment within the reactor. The inspections showed that the FRP structures that were replaced in 2007 and 2008 are holding up well, but that some of the stainless steel components within the reactor are starting to pit and corrode. Since it will likely be several years until this reactor is taken out of service again, the WPC staff has decided to repair and replace the corroded stainless steel components now before putting Reactor No. 3 back in service.

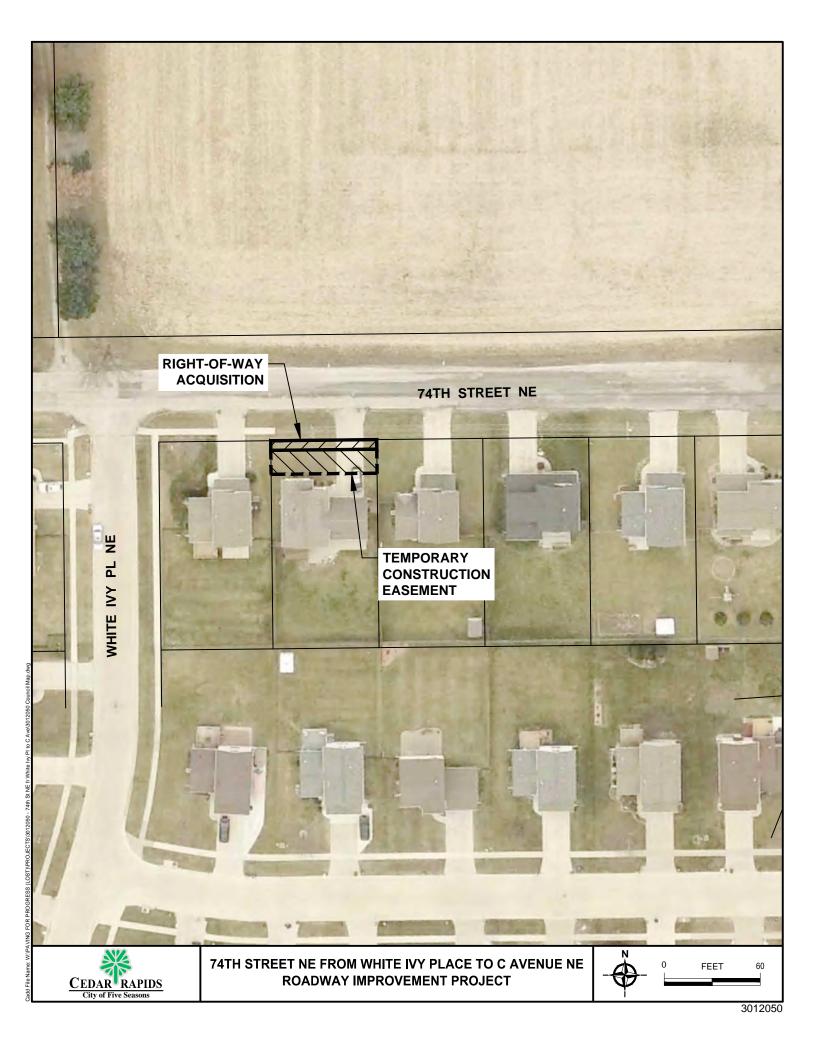

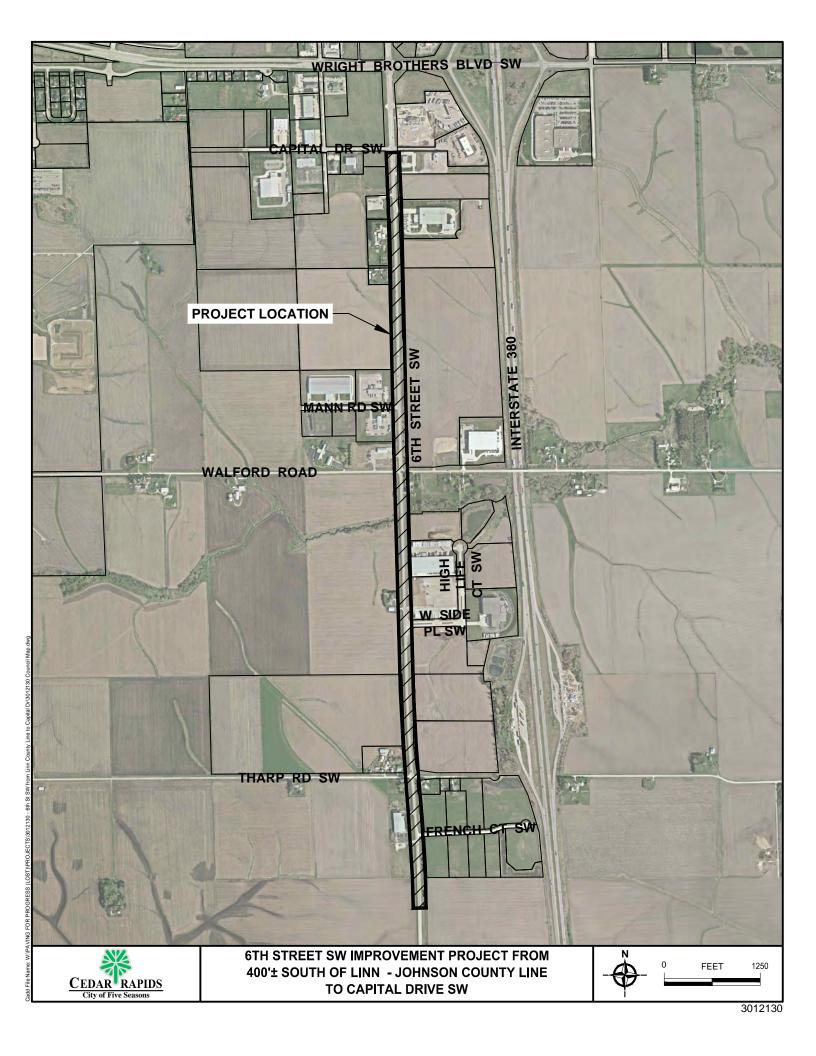

- d. When an appraisal is required, an opportunity to accompany at least one appraiser of the acquiring agency who appraises your property. (lowa Code §6B.54)
- e. Participate in good faith negotiations with the acquiring agency before the acquiring agency begins condemnation proceedings. (Iowa Code §6B.3 (1))
- f. If you cannot agree on a purchase price with the acquiring agency, a determination of just compensation by an impartial compensation commission and the right to appeal its award to district court. (Iowa Code §§6B.4, 6B.7, and 6B.18)
- g. A review by the compensation commission of the necessity of the condemnation if your property is agricultural land being condemned for industry; (Iowa Code §6B.4A)
- h. Payment of the agreed upon purchase price or if condemned, a deposit of the compensation commission award before you are required to surrender possession of the property. (Iowa Code §§6B.25 and 6B.54(11))
- i. Reimbursement for expenses incidental to transferring title to the acquiring agency. (Iowa Code §§6B.33 and 6B54(10))
- j. Reimbursement of certain litigation expenses: (1) if the award of the compensation commissioners exceeds 110 percent of the acquiring agency's final offer before condemnation; and (2) if the award on appeal in court is more than the compensation commissioner's award. (lowa Code §6B.33)
- k. At least 90 days written notice to vacate occupied property. (lowa Code §6B.54(4))
- Relocation services and payments, if you are eligible to receive them, and the right to appeal your eligibility for and amount of payments. (lowa Code §316.9)

Following approval of the "Special Assessment" Resolution, the nuisance abatement information is turned over to the Linn County Treasurer and the outstanding payment is levied against the property owner's taxes for collection.

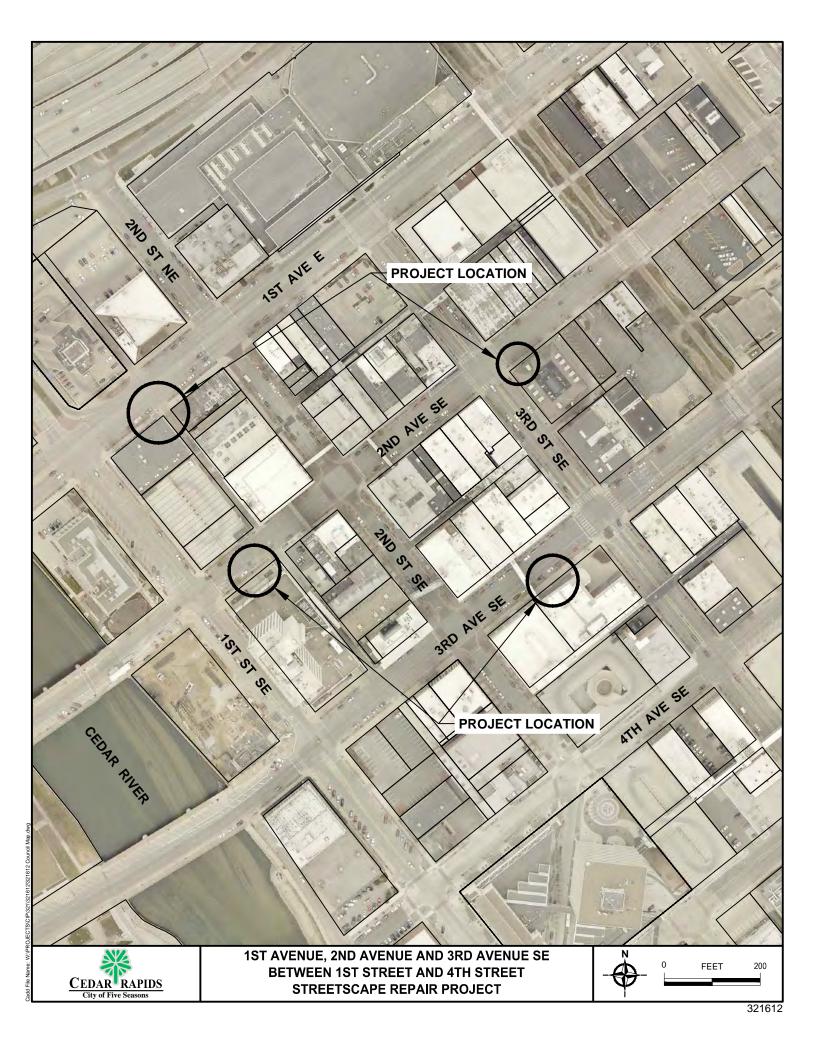

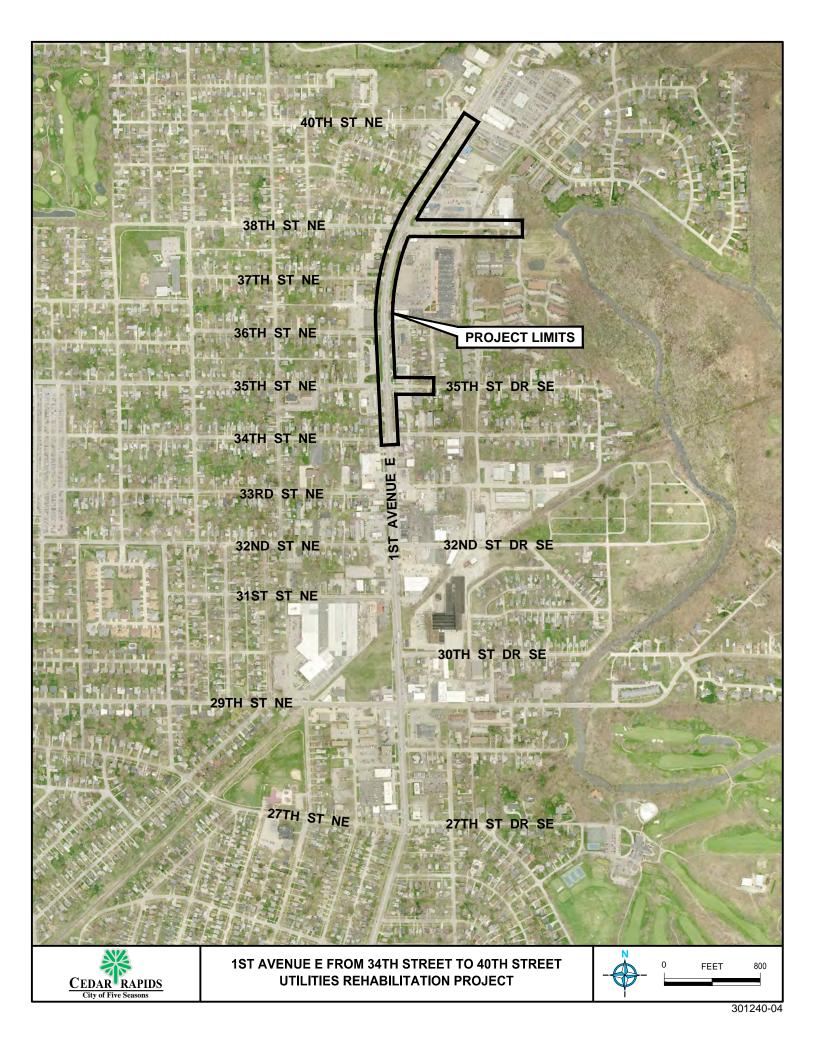

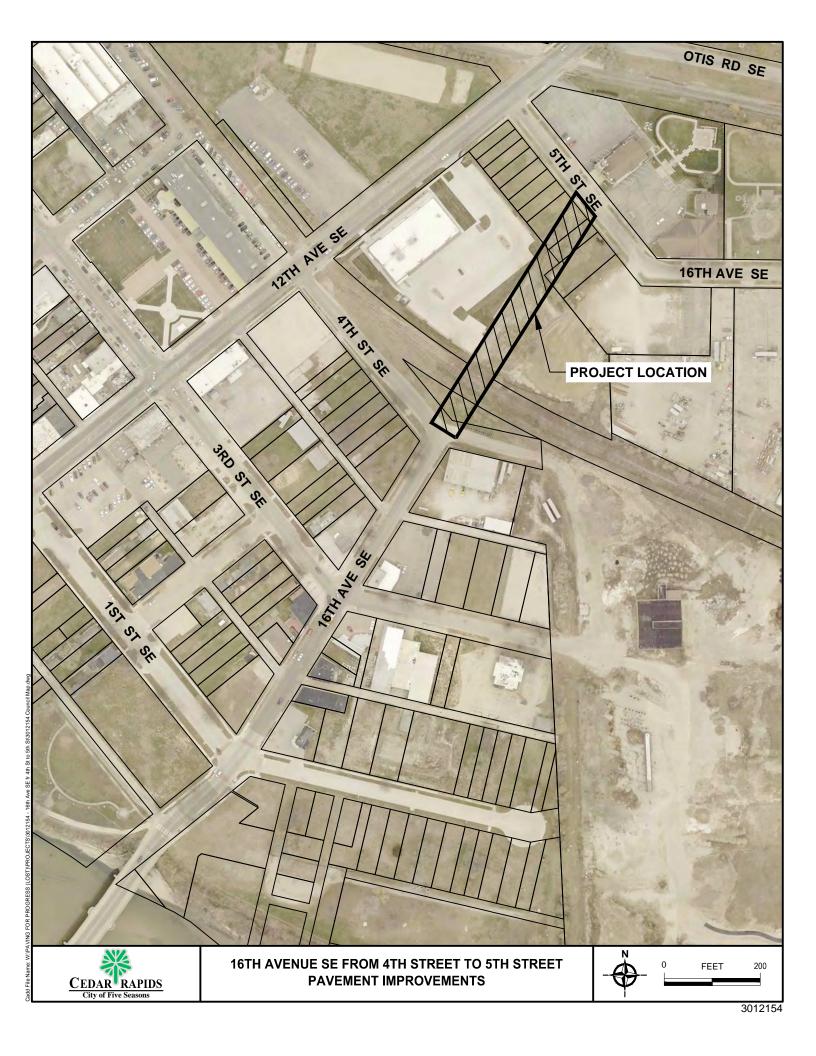

Braun Intertec Corporation recently completed a Risk Evaluation/Response Action Plan (RE/RAP) to describe remedial actions to address environmental conditions at the site and to characterize residual risk using evaluation models developed by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR).

Under this contract, Braun Intertec Corporation will install four additional groundwater wells, complete soil vapor monitoring up to three years, complete semi-annual groundwater monitoring up to five years, and complete all necessary reporting to the IDNR to show that remedial efforts at the site have been effective.

The City has requested that the term of the CDBG be extended until May 29, 2017. After that time, the remaining cost of the contract will be paid for by the previous owner of the property.

Action/Recommendation: The Public Works Department recommends adopting the resolution authorizing execution of a professional services agreement with Braun Intertec Corporation.

The property has been awarded through a competitive proposal process and the City and developer are ready to execute the Development Agreement and deed to allow construction on the home to begin. The modifications to the administrative plan allow for development in Tiers 1, 2, and 3 under the following circumstances:

EnvisionCR Element/Goal: StrengthenCR Goal 2: Improve the quality and identity of neighborhoods and key corridors.

Background:

The City received a petition requesting creation of a Self-Supporting Medical Improvement District (SSMID) on August 24, 2015 signed by property owners in the proposed Czech Village-New Bohemia SSMID area (see attached map).

The purpose of the proposed Czech Village-New Bohemia Self Supported Municipal Improvement District, as set forth in the petition filed with the City Clerk on August 24, will be the undertaking of actions intended to benefit the property within the District. The activities will include:

- Economic Development
- Communications and Advocacy
- Capital Improvements
- Enhanced Maintenance
- Parking Management

The Iowa Code requires that a petition to create or expand a SSMID must be made by 25% of the property owners representing at least 25% of the assessed property value in the district. The petition for the creation of the Czech Village-New Bohemia SSMID was signed by owners of 60 of the 104 taxable parcels (57%) representing 62% of the assessed value for the proposed expansion area.

The petition states that if approved, the District will be created for a period of seven (7) years, commencing with a levy of taxes for collection in Fiscal Year 2017. After the seven (7) year period, the District may be renewed following the same petitioning process. Properties within the proposed District boundary area will be taxed \$1 per thousand dollars of taxable value in the first year. During the remaining lifetime of the District, properties within the proposed District

boundary area will be taxed with rates of assessment not to exceed \$3 per thousand dollars of taxable valuation in the next six (6) years. The levy rate of \$3 is the maximum combined rate which may be used for debt service, capital improvements, or operations.

The City of Cedar Planning Commission reviewed the request and unanimously supported the SSMID on September 10, 2015. As such, the CPC recommends approval to City Council (CPC Resolution of Support attached). The steps in the process include the following:

The proposed boundary generally encompasses the area bounded by 8th Avenue SE from the Cedar River to Union Pacific Rail Line, Union Pacific Rail Line from 8th Avenue SE to 15th Avenue SE, includes former Sinclair Meat Packing Plant site, 21st Avenue SW from Cedar River to C Street SW, C Street SW from 21st Avenue SW to 17th Avenue SW, 17th Avenue SW from C Street SW to Hamilton Street SW, 12th Avenue SW from Hamilton Street SW to Cedar River Trail, and Cedar River Trail to 8th Avenue SE.

WHEREAS, said proposal has been referred to the City Planning Commission of the City for evaluation in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 386 of the Code of Iowa;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, that following due consideration and review of the proposed "CZECH VILLAGE-NEW BOHEMIA SELF-SUPPORTING MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT," including a staff report form the Community Development and Planning Department of the City, the City Planning Commission hereby finds and determines:

- With regard to merit, said proposal satisfies the statutory requirements of Chapter 386 of the Code of Iowa as related to location, land usage, and rate and purpose of tax. Further, said proposal is in conformance with the general plan for the development of the municipality as a whole.

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE CZECH VILLAGE-NEW BOHEMIA SELF-SUPPORTED MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 386, CODE OF IOWA; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FUNDS AND THE LEVY OF ANNUAL TAXES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the City of Cedar Rapids, in the County of Linn, State of Iowa, is authorized by Chapter 386, Code of Iowa (the "Act"), to create a self-supported municipal improvement district, as defined in the Act, in the City, to provide for the existence and operation of such district, to provide for improvements or self-liquidating improvements, as defined in the Act, for such district, to authorize and issue bonds for the purposes of such district and to levy such taxes as are authorized by the Act with respect to such district; and

WHEREAS, there was filed with the City Clerk on the 24th day of August, 2015, a petition petitioning the City Council to establish a self-supported municipal improvement district (the "proposed District") in accordance with the Act, to establish an operation fund, a capital improvement fund and a debt service fund with respect to the Proposed District and in accordance with the Act and to levy an annual tax for each of such funds in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, the petition is in all ways in complete compliance with the provisions of the Act; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of such petition, the City Planning Commission did review the merits and feasibility of the petition and recommended the establishment of the district to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has filed with the City Council such evaluative report on the merits and feasibility of the project proposed in the petition, all in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the filing of the aforementioned report, the Council did set the 20th day of October, 2015, at 4:00pm, at the Council Chamber, City Hall, in the City, as the time and place for a meeting at which it proposed to take action for the establishment of the Proposed District and did in accordance with the Act publish notice of such meeting as provided in Section 362.3 of the Code of Iowa, and the Clerk did mail written notice of such meeting to each owner of property within the Proposed District, which notice was mailed to such property owners by certified mail not less than fifteen days before such meeting; and

WHEREAS, at the aforementioned time and place, the Council did meet and hear owners of property in the Proposed District and residents of the City desiring to express their views with respect to the establishment of the Proposed District; and

WHEREAS, no petition has been filed with the City Clerk containing the signatures of at least 40 percent of all owners of property within the Proposed District or signatures which together represent ownership of property with an assessed value of 40 percent or more of the

assessed value of all property within the Proposed District seeking to have the entire matter of establishing the Proposed District withdrawn from Council consideration; and

WHEREAS, more than thirty days have passed since the holding of the public hearing referred to above and the Council may now proceed with the establishment of a self-supported municipal improvement district in accordance with the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained and Enacted by the Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, State of Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be and there is hereby created in the City a self-supported municipal improvement district, as defined in the Act, the name of which shall be the Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District (sometimes hereinafter referred to as the "District"), the purposes of which District are the undertaking of actions and the design and construction of any and all "improvements" and "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act and the performance of administration, redevelopment and revitalization of the District, as authorized by the Act.

Section 2. The District shall include all property within the boundaries described in Exhibit A and mapped in Exhibit B.

Section 3. It is hereby found and determined that the owners of all of the property within the District have a present and potential benefit from the condition, development and maintenance of the District and that all of the property within the District is related by virtue of its location and use so as to be benefited by the condition, development and maintenance of the District or is otherwise related in some manner such that inclusion in the District meets the requirements of the Act.

Section 4. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, there is hereby established and created a self-supported improvement district operation fund, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Operation Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Operation Fund"), for which Operation Fund the City may certify taxes (the "Operation Tax") against the property, as defined in the Act (excluding property assessed as residential property for property tax purposes), within the District (the "Property") each year, in addition to all other taxes, commencing with the levy of taxes for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and continuing for 6 additional years, for the purpose of paying such expenses of the District as are authorized by the Act, including, but not limited to, the administrative expenses of the District and part or all of the maintenance expenses of the District, and part or all of the maintenance expenses of "improvements" or "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act, for a period of 7 years.

Section 5. The Operation Tax, as provided in Section 5 hereof, shall be levied annually upon the Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 6. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, there is hereby established and created a capital improvement fund for such District, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Capital Improvement Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Capital Improvement Fund"), for which Capital Improvement Fund the City may certify taxes (the "Capital Improvement Fund Tax") each year, commencing with the levy of taxes for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and continuing for 6 additional years, to be levied against all of the Property in the District, in addition to all other

taxes, for the purpose of accumulating moneys for the financing or payment of a part or all of the cost of any "improvements" or "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act.

Section 7. The Capital Improvement fund Tax, as provided in Section 7 hereof, shall be levied annually upon the Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 8. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, whenever any self-supported municipal improvement district bonds, as defined in the Act, are issued and outstanding with respect to the District, other than revenue bonds, the City shall establish, create and maintain a self-supported municipal improvement district debt service fund for such District, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Debt Service Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Debt Service Fund"), and shall certify taxes (the "Debt Service Fund Tax") each year to be levied against all of the Property in the District in an amount necessary to pay interest as it becomes due and to pay, or to create a sinking fund to pay, principal at maturity of all self-supported municipal improvement district bonds, as defined in the Act.

Section 9. The Debt Service Fund Tax, as provided in Section 9 hereof, shall be levied annually upon Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 10. The combined rate of the Operation Tax, the Capital Improvement Fund Tax and the Debt Service Fund Tax to be levied annually, in addition to all other taxes, as aforesaid shall not exceed a rate of Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 11. There is hereby created the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Commission." (Hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"). The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. The current Czech Village-New Bohemia District Steering Committee shall recommend members to be appointed to the Commission and file a list of such candidates with the City Clerk within sixty (60) days of the publication of this ordinance.

Section 12. The Commission shall perform those duties and functions associated with the operation, supervision, maintenance and management of the district. The Commission may make rules and regulations as necessary and appropriate relating to the management and operation of the District.

Section 13. The Commission shall file with the City Clerk an annual budget for consideration and approval by the City Council. The annual budget shall contain at a minimum, the sources of funds, uses of funds, and how those uses are related to the stated goals of the District. The Commission shall be authorized and to otherwise raise funds by solicitation and contributions. All monies of the District shall be maintained in one or more special funds in the City Treasurer's office with expenditures from said funds to be made by the approval by the City Council. In addition, the Commission shall have authority to expend such funds as may be authorized by the City Council.

Section 14. From and after the effective date of this ordinance the City Clerk shall cause a copy of this ordinance to be filed in the office of the County Recorder of Linn County.

Section 15. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed insofar as the conflicting portions thereof are concerned.

Section 16. The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence, or provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of this ordinance, which can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

Section 17. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect with its passage and publication, according to the laws of the State of Iowa.

- With regard to merit, said proposal satisfies the statutory requirements of Chapter 386 of the Code of Iowa as related to location, land usage, and rate and purpose of tax. Further, said proposal is in conformance with the general plan for the development of the municipality as a whole.
- With regard to feasibility, said proposal will generate sufficient funds to undertake and implement improvements, which will strengthen, renovate, and revitalize the District as a diversified economic center.
