## Background:

The Resolution and Ordinance establishes an Urban Renewal Area to provide a mechanism to provide City financial participation under the City's High Quality Jobs and Green Building Program.

The City has received a request for City participation under the High Quality Jobs and Green Building Programs from Miron Construction Co., Inc. and Commercial Horizons for the construction of an office and warehouse building at 335 French Ct SW. On November 3, 2015 the City Council adopted Resolution Nos. 1581-11-15 and 1536-11-15 which approved financial support for the Miron Construction office facility under the High Quality Jobs and Green Building program and to begin the process of establishing the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area as the mechanism for the City participation.

The proposed project includes construction of a 12,000 square foot LEED-certified office building and 6,800 square foot warehouse facility to house the office and construction operations of Miron Construction, Inc. with a total estimated investment of \$4.0 million. Miron's project will consolidate its eastern lowa office and construction operations, part of which is currently located within Cedar Rapids' corporate limits. The site will allow for future expansion capabilities.

The establishment of the Urban Renewal Area is based on the following schedule:

- 11/03/15 Setting the public hearing
- 11/18/15 Consultation with affected taxing agencies
- 12/03/15 City Planning Commission Review
- 12/15/15 Public hearing and introduction of First Reading

To qualify for City assistance, Miron must add 10 or more employees whose pay is at or above the State's labor shed wage threshold for the High Quality Jobs program. Additionally, to receive the incentive boost provided under the City's Green Building program, the development is required to be LEED certified, as is being proposed. Those and other terms will be included in a Development Agreement which will be presented before the City Council at a later date.

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined that one or more economic development areas, as defined in Chapter 403, Code of Iowa, exist within the City of Cedar Rapids and rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or combination thereof, of these areas are necessary in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, this Council has reasonable cause to believe that the area described below satisfies the eligibility criteria for designation as an Urban Renewal Area under Iowa Law and has caused there to be prepared a proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area described therein which proposed Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area described below has been prepared, which proposed Plan is on file in the office of the City Clerk and which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, this proposed Urban Renewal Area includes and consists of an area commonly known as 335 French Court SW and specifically described as follows:

# LOT 5, ROGER L. FRENCH ADDITION TO THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, LINN COUNTY IOWA

WHEREAS, it is desirable that this area continue to be developed as an economic development project under the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes require the City Council to submit the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area to the Planning Commission for review and recommendation as to its conformity with the general plan for development of the community as a whole, prior to City Council approval of such Urban Renewal Project and the Urban Renewal Plan therefore; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area has been reviewed by the Planning Commission with the finding that the said Plan is in conformity with the general plan for the development of the City as a whole; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 1536-11-15 adopted on November 3, 2015, the City Council directed that a consultation be held with the designated representatives of all affected taxing entities to discuss the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area and the division of revenue described therein, and that notice of said consultation and a copy of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area be sent to all affected taxing entities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such notice, the consultation was duly held as ordered by the City Council and no written objections were made by any of the affected taxing entities and that the minutes of the said consultation meeting as set forth with Community Development Department are filed herewith and incorporated herein by this reference, for which no responses are necessary; and

WHEREAS, by said Resolution this Council also set a Public Hearing on the adoption of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area for this meeting of the Council, and due and proper notice of said Public Hearing was given, as provided by Law, by timely publication in the Cedar Rapids Gazette, which notice sets forth the time and place for this hearing and the nature and purpose thereof; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with said notice, all persons or organizations desiring to be heard on said proposed Plan, both for and against, have been given an opportunity to be heard with respect thereto and due consideration has been given to all comments and views expressed to this Council in connection therewith and said Public Hearing has been closed.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA as follows:

- 1. That the findings and conclusions set forth or contained in the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area for the area of the City of Cedar Rapids, lowa legally described and depicted in the Plan and incorporated herein by reference (which area shall hereinafter be known as the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area), be and the same are hereby adopted and approved as the findings of this Council for this area.
- 2. That this Council further finds (a) there will be no displacement from the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area as a result of activities associated with implementation of the said Urban Renewal Plan; (b) the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area conforms to the general plan for the development of the City as a whole; and (c) there are no areas of open land to be acquired by the City within the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area.
- 3. That the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area is an economic development area within the meaning of Iowa Code Chapter 403; that such area is eligible for designation as an Urban Renewal Area and otherwise meets all requisites under the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or a combination thereof, of such area is necessary and in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of this City.
- 4. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herewith by reference, be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area and is hereby in all respects approved, and the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of said Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area with the proceedings of this meeting with the County Recorder for Linn County.
- 5. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area shall be in full force and effect from the date of this Resolution until the later of any date of termination set forth the Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area or the date on

which payment of all obligations issued or advances made to carry out the purposes thereof shall be fully provided for. Said Urban Renewal Plan for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area shall be forthwith certified by the City Clerk and along with a copy of this Resolution, transmitted to the Recorder of Linn County, Iowa, to be filed and recorded in the manner provided by Law.

#### INTRODUCTION

This Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan") has been prepared by the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa (the "City") to provide for the development of the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area (the "Project Area") of the City, and to stimulate, through public actions, financings and commitments, private investment in the urban renewal Project Area. In order to achieve these objectives, the City shall undertake the urban renewal actions specified in this Urban Renewal Plan, pursuant to the powers granted to it under Chapters 403 and 15A of the Code of Iowa, 2015, as amended (the "Code").

#### I. URBAN RENEWAL PLAN OBJECTIVES

The City has designated the Project Area as an "economic development area" as defined under Chapter 403. The primary objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan for the Project Area are as follows:

- 1. To stimulate through public action and commitment, private investment in new commercial and manufacturing development;
  - 2. To plan and provide sufficient land for new and expanding private development;
- 3. To attract new businesses to the City and to encourage the expansion of existing City businesses;
- 4. To provide a more marketable and attractive investment climate through the use of various federal, state and local incentives;
- 5. To ensure that the Project Area is adequately served with public facilities, roadways, utilities and services; and
- 6. To achieve a diversified, well-balanced economy providing a desirable standard of living, creating job opportunities for City residents and strengthening the property tax base of the City.

#### II. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AREA

The Project Area is an "urban renewal area" as defined in the Code and is located within the City of Cedar Rapids, Linn County, Iowa. The boundaries of the Project Area are illustrated on the Project Area Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The Project Area consists of an approximately 5.27 acres, in the City of Cedar Rapids, lowa and being described as follows:

LOT 5, ROGER L. FRENCH ADDITION TO THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, LINN COUNTY IOWA

#### **III. PROJECT AREA ACTIVITIES**

As a means of assisting in the development of the Project Area and fulfilling the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan, the City may determine:

- 1. To undertake and carry out urban renewal project activities through the execution of contracts and other instruments;
- 2. To arrange for or cause to be provided the construction or repair of public infrastructure improvements, including street, water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer systems, traffic signals, and public utilities or other facilities in connection with urban renewal projects;
- 3. To acquire property through a variety of means (purchase, lease, exchange, condemnation, donation or otherwise) and to hold, clear or prepare the property for redevelopment;
- 4. To dispose of property so acquired (by sale, lease, exchange or otherwise) for purposes of private redevelopment;
- 5. To provide financing to pay a portion of the cost of construction of new facilities and developments;
- 6. To undertake or cause to be undertaken the construction of specific site improvements, such as grading and site preparation activities, access roads and parking, fencing, utility connections and related activities, in connection with the disposition of property;
- 7. To make loans or grants to private persons or businesses for economic development purposes on such terms as may be determined by the City Council;
  - 8. To borrow money and provide security therefor;
- 9. To establish and enforce controls, standards and restrictions on land use and buildings;
- 10. To make or have made surveys and plans necessary for the implementation of the urban renewal program and specific urban renewal project activities;
- 11. To use tax increment financing to provide for necessary physical improvements and infrastructure, and to fund other urban renewal project costs; or
- 12. To use any and all other powers, without limitation, granted by the Code to develop and provide for improved economic conditions in the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

#### IV. SPECIAL FINANCING ACTIVITIES

To meet the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan and to encourage private investment in and the development of the Project Area, the City may determine to provide financial assistance to qualified private businesses through the making of loans or grants under Chapter 15A of the Code and through the use of tax increment financing under Chapter 403 of the Code.

- A. Chapter 15A Loans or Grants. The making of loans or grants of public funds to private businesses within the Project Area may be deemed necessary or appropriate for economic development purposes (as defined in Chapter 15A of the Code) and to aid in the planning, undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal project activities authorized under this Urban Renewal Plan and the Code. Accordingly, in furtherance of the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan, the City may determine to issue general obligation bonds, tax increment revenue bonds or other such obligations, or loan agreements for the purpose of making loans or grants of public funds to private businesses located in the Project Area. Alternatively, the City may determine to use available funds, including tax increment revenues from the Project Area, for making such loans or grants. In determining qualifications of recipients and whether to make any such individual loan or grant, the City shall consider, among other things, one or more of the factors set forth in Section 15A.1 of the Code on a case-by-case basis.
- B. Tax Increment Financing. The City intends to utilize tax increment financing as a means to help pay for the costs associated with the development of the Project Area. General obligation bonds, tax increment revenue bonds or other such obligations or loan agreements may be issued by the City, and tax increment reimbursement may be sought for, among other things, the following costs (if and to the extent incurred by the City):
- 1. The construction of public improvements, such as streets, sanitary sewers, storm sewers, water mains or sidewalks;
- 2. The funding of the "local match" required under State programs providing financial assistance to private developers; and
- 3. The making of loans or grants to private businesses under Chapter 15A of the Code, including debt service payments on any bonds or notes issued to finance such loans or grants.

Nothing herein shall be construed as a limitation on the power of the City to exercise any lawful power granted to the City under Chapter 15A, Chapter 403, Chapter 427B, or any other provision of the Code in furtherance of the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan.

#### V. PROPERTY ACQUISITION

All of the properties located within the Project Area are owned by CHIMiron Cedar Rapids, LLC, and the City does not presently intend to acquire any land in the Project Area for purposes of private development. Areas may be identified for acquisition in the future for the following purposes:

- 1. To provide sites for needed private and public improvements or facilities in proper relationship to the projected demand for such facilities and in accordance with accepted criteria for the development of such facilities;
- 2. To assemble land into parcels of adequate size and shape to meet contemporary development needs and standards and to allow new construction to meet the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan; or

3. To acquire any and all interests in any property within the Project Area which in any way dominates or controls usage of other real property proposed to be acquired.

#### VI. CLEARANCE AND DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY

All of the properties located within the Project Area are owned by CHIMiron Cedar Rapids, LLC and being built by and leased to Miron Construction, Inc. and the City does not presently intend to clear or dispose of property in the Project Area. If the City makes improvements in preparation for redevelopment or transfer of land to private developers, all improvements will be accomplished in accordance with the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan and in concert with other actions to ensure timely improvement of the land.

The City may advertise and solicit development proposals, may negotiate directly with prospective developers, and may dispose of all or a portion of any property acquired by it for the purpose of redevelopment in accordance with the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan. The property so disposed of may include vacated right-of-way and other lands under public ownership which are not needed for public purposes.

The City may subdivide, vacate or otherwise change the recorded arrangement of property under its control to accomplish the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan.

#### VII. LAND USE DEVELOPMENT

The planning criteria to be used to guide the physical development of the Project Area are those standards and guidelines contained within the City's Comprehensive Plan – EnvisionCR approved on January 27, 2015, as amended from time to time.

#### VIII. DEVELOPER REQUIREMENTS

In consideration of the efforts to be made by the City in furthering the development of the Project Area, developers who purchase land in the Project Area may be required to observe the land use requirements of this Urban Renewal Plan and to enter into a contractual agreement with the City in order to assure that the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan are furthered or achieved.

Developers will not be permitted to defer the start of construction for a period longer than that required to prepare architectural plans, obtain satisfactory financing, and the review and approval of such plans by the City in order to establish their conformance with the provisions of this Urban Renewal Plan. In addition, it is expected that the following provisions will be included in agreements with developers:

1. Developers will submit plans and schedules for the proposed development to the City and will keep the City informed regarding progress on implementing these plans;

- 2. Any land purchased from the City can only be used for the purpose of development, and not for speculation;
- 3. Any ownership parcel made up in part of land acquired from the City will be built upon and improved in conformity with the objectives and provisions of this Urban Renewal Plan;
- 4. Construction of improvements will be initiated and completed within a reasonable time; and
- 5. There will be no discrimination against any person or group of persons on account of race, creed, color, national origin or ancestry in the sale, lease, sublease, transfer, use of enjoyment of the premises therein conveyed, nor will the developers themselves, or any claiming under or through them, establish or permit such practices of discrimination or segregation with respect to the selection, location, number, use or occupancy of tenants, lessees, or sub lessees in the premises therein conveyed.

The contract and other disposition documents to be executed by the developer will set forth, in detail, the provisions, standards and criteria for achieving the objectives and land use requirements established in this Urban Renewal Plan.

#### IX. PROJECT AND CITY INDEBTEDNESS

The City may agree to make economic development grants to the developer in consideration for certain employment commitments and other covenants expected to be made by the developer. As such, the eventual level of City participation in both private and public improvements for the economic development of the Project Area cannot be fully determined at this time. However, to the extent that new tax increment revenues are generated and other appropriate funding sources are identified, the City may undertake other project-related activities in the future.

At the present time, it is anticipated that future City tax increment collections for project-related activities within the Project Area will not exceed \$1,000,000.00 in aggregate amount during the term of this Urban Renewal Plan. Proceeds of such tax increment collections are currently expected to be used to make economic development grants to the developer and to reimburse the City for any other project-related costs incurred in connection with the development of the Project Area.

As of June 30, 2015, the City's outstanding general obligation indebtedness was \$315,200,000. Article XI, Section 3 of the Constitution of the State of Iowa limits the amount of City debt outstanding at any time to no more than five percent (5%) of the value, as shown by the last certified state and City tax list, of all taxable property within the City. Based upon the actual value for fiscal year 2014/2015 (total actual value, less agriculture value that is not taxed for debt service) on all taxable property within the City of Cedar Rapids, the City is limited to \$490,817,852.00 of general obligation indebtedness.

#### X. STATE AND LOCAL REQUIREMENTS

All provisions necessary to conform to state and local law will be complied with by the City in implementing this Urban Renewal Plan and its supporting documents.

#### XI. SEVERABILITY

In the event one or more provisions contained in this Urban Renewal Plan shall be held for any reason to be invalid, illegal, unauthorized or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or lack of authorization or enforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Urban Renewal Plan, and this Urban Renewal Plan shall be construed and implemented as if such provisions had never been contained herein.

#### XII. AMENDMENT OF URBAN RENEWAL PLAN

This Urban Renewal Plan may be amended from time to time to respond to development opportunities. Any such amendment shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code. Any change affecting any property or contractual right will be effectuated only in accordance with applicable state and local law.

#### XIII. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Urban Renewal Plan shall be effective upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or rescinded by the City Council. However, the use of tax increment financing revenues (including the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness or bonds which qualify for payment from the division of revenue provided in Section 403.19 of the Code) by the City for activities carried out under this Urban Renewal Plan shall be limited as deemed appropriate by the City Council and consistent with all applicable provisions of law, including Iowa Code Section 403.17(10).

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES ARE LEVIED AND COLLECTED EACH YEAR ON ALL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE MIRON CONSTRUCTION URBAN RENEWAL AREA OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, COUNTY OF LINN, STATE OF IOWA, BY AND FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE STATE OF IOWA, CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, COUNTY OF LINN, COLLEGE COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND OTHER TAXING DISTRICTS, BE PAID TO A SPECIAL FUND FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON LOANS, MONIES ADVANCED TO AND INDEBTEDNESS, INCLUDING BONDS ISSUED OR TO BE ISSUED, INCURRED BY SAID CITY IN CONNECTION WITH URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PLAN FOR THE MIRON CONSTRUCTION URBAN RENEWAL AREA.

WHEREAS, the City Council, after public notice and hearing and as prescribed by law and pursuant to Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_\_ passed and approved on the 15th day of December, 2015, adopted the Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan") for an urban renewal area known as the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Project Area") that includes lots and parcels located within the area described as follows:

Lot 5, Roger L. French Addition to the City of Cedar Rapids, Linn County, Iowa

WHEREAS, expenditures and indebtedness are anticipated to be incurred by the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa in the future to finance urban renewal project activities carried out in furtherance of the objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa desires to provide for the division of revenue from taxation in the Urban Renewal Project Area, as above described, in accordance with the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, that:

Section 1: The taxes levied on the taxable property in the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area, legally described in Section 1 hereof, by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, City of Cedar Rapids, County of Linn, College Community School District, and all other taxing districts from and after the effective date of this Ordinance shall be divided as hereinafter in this Ordinance provided.

Section 2: That portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Project Area, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which the City of Cedar Rapids certifies to the County Auditor of the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the division of property tax revenue described herein (which certification is directed to be made during the 2015 calendar year), shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for the taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid (base year taxes).

Section 3: That portion of the taxes each year in excess of the base period taxes for the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the special tax increment fund previously established by the City of Cedar Rapids to pay the principal of and interest on loans, monies advanced to, or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under authority of Section 403.9 or Section 403.12 of the Code of Iowa, incurred by the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, urban renewal projects undertaken within the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area pursuant to the Urban Renewal Plan for said Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area, except that taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area without any limitation as hereinabove provided.

Section 4: Unless or until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the areas of the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in said areas shown by the assessment rolls referred to in Section 3 of this Ordinance, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for the taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes.

Section 5: At such time as the loans, monies advanced, bonds and interest thereon and indebtedness of the City of Cedar Rapids referred to in Section 4 hereof have been paid, all monies thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

Section 7: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. The provisions of this Ordinance are intended and shall be construed so as to continue the division of taxes from property within the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area under the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, as amended with respect to the division of taxes from property within the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area as described above. In the event that any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be contrary to law it shall not affect other provisions or application of this Ordinance which shall at all times be construed to fully invoke the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa with reference to the Miron Construction Urban Renewal Area and the territory contained therein.

<u>Section 8</u>: This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 32 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, THE ZONING ORDINANCE, BY DELETING SECTIONS 32.05.020.A.5 AND 32.05.020.A.6 THEREFROM AND ENACTING IN THEIR PLACES IN LIEU THEREOF A NEW SECTION 32.05.020.A.5 TO CORRECT A SCRIVENER'S ERROR

WHEREAS, On May 13, 2014 the Cedar Rapids City Council approved Ordinance No. 027-14 which among other things updated and clarified requirements within Chapter 32 of the Municipal Code, the Zoning Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 027-14 contained a scrivener's error in that new Section 32.05.020.A.5 was duplicated in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 027-14 and codified as a new Section 32.05.020.A.6, and

WHEREAS, to correct this situation, Sections 32.05.020.A.5 and 32.05.020.A.6 as they now exist should be deleted and a new Section 32.05.020.A.5 be enacted in their places.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, as follows:

**Section 1.** Cedar Rapids Municipal Code Chapter 32, the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting sections 32.05.020.A.5 – Detached Garage Limitations and 32.05.020.A.6 – Use Limitations.

**Section 2.** Cedar Rapids Municipal Code Chapter 32, the Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended adding a new Section 32.05.020.A.5 as follows:

"32.05.020.A.5

### 5. Use Limitations

- a) Except as may additionally be provided for the parking of trucks and other large vehicles, accessory off-street parking facilities provided in accord with the requirements of this Ordinance shall be (i) solely for the parking of passenger motor vehicles of patrons, occupants, visitors, or employees of such uses, or (ii) for a temporary use specifically permitted on such parking areas by this Ordinance, and in compliance with any conditions or limitations imposed by this Ordinance.
- b) No person shall park, place, keep or store, or permit the parking or storage of a stock car, racing car, inoperable vehicle, vehicular component parts, or miscellaneous junk and debris on any public or private property, in any zoning district, unless it shall be in a completely enclosed building. Stock cars and racing cars are allowed to be parked outside on private property for a period of no more than twelve (12) consecutive hours. This regulation shall not apply to legitimate businesses operating in a lawful place and manner, provided that any outside areas used for parking and storage are screened from public view if required by the regulations of the zoning district within which they are located. Restrictions contained in Sec. 61.102 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code shall also apply.
- c) No such vehicles or equipment shall be used for living, sleeping, or housekeeping purposes while so parked or stored."

**Section 3.** Separability of Provisions. It is the intention of the Council that each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, and provision of the Ordinance is separable, and, if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof than that affected by such decision.

**Section 4.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.

**Section 5.** That the afore described Amended Chapter 32 shall be included as part of the replacement pages of the Municipal Code, City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and made a part of said Code as provided by law.

**Section 6.** That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

A public hearing will be held to consider amending Chapter 22A of the Municipal code, Nuisance Property, by deleting Chapter 22A and enacting new 22A in its place, establishing regulations relating to statement of public policy, nuisance activity, service of notice, prohibitions, and administrative appeals.

**EnvisionCR Element/Goal:** StrengthenCR Goal 2: Improve the quality and identity of neighborhoods and key corridors.

**Background**: The City of Cedar Rapids has an interest in ensuring properties within the City limits are free of nuisance activity. The SAFE-CR Program strives to protect the quiet enjoyment of neighborhoods, provide efficient use of taxpayer funded services to citizens, and ensure properties are well maintained through enforcement of Chapter 22A. The City recognizes that nuisances detract from the enjoyment and livability of a neighborhood, infringe on individual property rights, and drive up the costs incurred by the City.

In June 2015, SAFE-CR implemented a new Focus Group to further address questions and concerns in regard to the Chapter 22A Ordinance. By requesting feedback, answering questions, and discussing various concerns, the focus group has identified ways to improve upon a program each member is very passionate about. The goal of the Focus Group has not been to change the intent of the ordinance, but rather improve upon it by creating suggested changes in specific ordinance language that the group can agree upon. In addition, we have strengthened relationships between our participating entities and the individuals they serve.

#### CHAPTER 22A - NUISANCE PROPERTIES

#### 22A.01 - STATEMENT OF PUBLIC POLICY.

The City of Cedar Rapids has an interest in ensuring a higher quality of life for its citizens, preserving property values and controlling the costs of taxpayer funded services such as police, fire and property code enforcement. In furtherance of that interest, the City seeks to ensure that properties within the City limits are well maintained and are not resorted to for purposes of unlawful conduct or conduct which disturbs the peaceable use of surrounding properties. Accordingly, it is the policy of the City that properties which are shown to be Nuisance Properties as defined by this Chapter shall be subject to the abatement process and charges set forth herein.

The City also has an interest in encouraging individuals to contact police and fire for emergency assistance. Accordingly, it is the policy of the City that the provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to a call made for Emergency Assistance as defined by this Chapter.

Further, the City acknowledges that conduct within the scope of this Chapter may arise out of a mental health condition and that, accordingly, any documented mental health condition of which City Officials are made aware may be taken into account when applying the terms of this Chapter.

#### 22A.02 - DEFINITIONS.

As used in this Chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- a. "Abate" means to prevent and/or eliminate.
- b. "City Manager" means that person employed by the City as its City Manager or designee of that person.
- c. "Call for Service" means any occasion on which one or more members of any City Department go to a Property for purposes of investigating suspected Nuisance Activity. A Call for Service is not Founded unless it meets the definition herein of "Founded Call for Service."
- d. "Corrective Action" means any action taken with respect to a Nuisance Property for the purpose of Abating Nuisance Activity.
- e. "Emergency Assistance" means immediate intervention by first responders in order to prevent or stop further damage to person or property.
- f. "Founded Call for Service" means any occasion on which a Call for Service results in a finding of probable cause to believe Nuisance Activity occurred on or within one thousand feet of the Property to which the Call for Service was made. A Founded Call for Service shall not be applied if an Interested Party is the party who reported the criminal activity that resulted in the Call for Service to the City.
- g. "Health, Environmental or Solid Waste violation" means a violation of Chapter 21, Chapter 24, Chapter 25, or Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code.
- h. "Interested Party" means a Property Owner, resident, tenant, occupant or person in possession or control of a property.
- i. "Nuisance Activity" means conduct giving rise to the conditions, events, and/or situations described in Section 22A.03.
- j. "Nuisance Property" means a Property which meets the criteria set forth in Section 22A.03.
- k. "Nuisance Property Abatement Plan" means that written plan which is developed by

- a Property Owner, whether or not it is developed in consultation with the Nuisance Property Abatement Coordinator, pursuant to which the Property Owner undertakes Corrective Action at a Nuisance Property.
- "Nuisance Property Abatement Coordinator ("NPAC") " is the City official charged with the administration and enforcement of this Chapter, or any duly authorized representative thereof.
- m. "Permittee" means a person present on a particular property where an Interested Party has allowed, consented to, or otherwise acquiesced in that person's presence, and shall include a person whose presence the Interested Party has failed to prevent or remove.
- n. "Property" means any real estate, including land, and that which is affixed, incidental, or appurtenant to the real estate. For Property consisting of more than one unit, the term Property may refer to a particular unit or to the portion of the Property on which Nuisance Activity has occurred or is occurring. Property may also include areas used in common by all units of the Property, including without limitation, other structures erected on the Property and areas used for parking, loading, and landscaping.
- o. "Property Owner" means the owner of record of the Property in question as shown on the City of Cedar Rapids Assessors website.
- p. The phrase "within one thousand feet of the Property" means the distance measured from the central point of any Nuisance Activity to the nearest point along the parcel line for the Property with which the Interested Party or Permittee is associated. For purposes of this Chapter, the Property of an Interested Party or Permittee who is not responsible for the Founded Nuisance Activity shall not be subject to Section 22A.03.

#### 22A.03 - NUISANCE PROPERTY

Property shall be deemed Nuisance Property upon a determination by the NPAC that any one or more of the following subsections is true with respect to the Property:

- a. One or more Founded Calls for Service have been made concerning the following Nuisance Activities at or within one thousand feet of the Property within a period of twelve consecutive months, whether committed by an Interested Party or Permittee(s) of an Interested Party:
  - Manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 124;
  - 2. Kidnapping as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 710;
  - 3. Arson as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 712;
  - 4. Burglary as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 713;
  - 5. Robbery as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 711;
  - 6. Sex abuse as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 709;
  - 7. Intimidation with a Dangerous Weapon as defined in Iowa Code Section 708.6;
  - 8. Willful injury as defined in Iowa Code Section 708.4;
  - 9. Sexual exploitation of a minor in violation of Iowa Code Section 728.12;
  - 10. Felony gambling in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 725.7;
  - 11. Felony criminal mischief as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 716;
  - 12. Animal contests in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 717D;
  - 13. Possessing or carrying a dangerous weapon as defined in Iowa Code Section 724;
  - 14. Riot as defined in Iowa Code Section 723.1:
  - 15. Failure to abate Odors or Offensive Annoyances as defined in Cedar Rapids

- Municipal Code Section 22.01(a)(2) and prohibited by Section 22.05 thereof;
- 16. Owning, keeping or harboring a Dangerous Animal as defined in Cedar Rapids Municipal Code Section 23.01 and prohibited by Section 23.21 thereof;
- 17. Prostitution as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 725.
- b. Two or more Founded Calls for Service have been made concerning the following Nuisance Activities at or within one thousand feet of the Property within a period of twelve consecutive months, whether committed by an Interested Party or Permittee(s) of an Interested Party:
  - 1. Possession of a controlled substance in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 124;
  - 2. Serious or aggravated misdemeanor criminal mischief as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 716;
  - 3. Serious or aggravated misdemeanor assault as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 708;
  - 4. Serious or aggravated misdemeanor theft as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 714;
  - 5. Misdemeanor gambling as defined in Iowa Code Chapter 725;
  - 6. False imprisonment as defined in Iowa Code Section 710.7;
  - 7. Failing to secure or keep secure a structure in accordance with Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and this code;
  - 8. An unpermitted or illegal use under Chapter 32 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - 9. Unlawful discharge of any device in violation of Section 63.10A (c) of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - 10. Engaging in conduct prohibited by Section 62.33 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code concerning Disorderly Houses and Wrongful Drinking Establishments;
  - 11. Failure to disperse from an unlawful assembly as defined in Iowa Code Section 723.3;
  - 12. Serious or aggravated misdemeanor gambling as defined by Iowa Code Chapter 725.
- c. Three or more Founded Calls for Service have been made concerning the following Nuisance Activities at or within one thousand feet of the Property within a period of twelve consecutive months, whether committed by an Interested Party or Permittee(s) of an Interested Party:
  - 1. A Health, Environmental, or Solid Waste violation as defined herein;
  - 2. Unlawful assembly in violation of Iowa Code Section 723.2;
  - 3. Defacing City Property and Graffiti as prohibited by Section 64.01, and/or Section 64.14, and/or Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - 4. Simple misdemeanor assault in violation of Iowa Code Chapter 708;
  - 5. Owning, keeping, harboring or knowingly permitting an animal to create such noise as to constitute a violation of Section 23.06 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - 6. Disturbing the peace in violation of Cedar Rapids Municipal Code 62.01;
  - 7. Consumption or intoxication in public places in violation of Iowa Code Section 123.46;
  - 8. Disorderly conduct in violation of Iowa Code Section 723.4;
  - 9. Persons under legal age in violation of Iowa Code Section 123.47;
  - 10. Making, continuing or causing the making or continuance of a Noise Disturbance as limited by Municipal Code Section 56.02;

- d. When any of the following occur upon the Property or within one thousand feet of the Property within a period of twelve consecutive months, except as otherwise specified, whether caused by an Interested Party or Permittee(s) of an Interested Party:
  - 1. The property is placarded pursuant to Chapter 29 Housing Code of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code, except when such placard is due solely to utility discontinuance for nonpayment of utility bill(s) by a tenant. When a property has been declared a Nuisance Property based on this paragraph, any call for service to that Nuisance Property which is deemed founded for Prohibited Occupancy, as defined in Municipal Code Chapter 29 and the International Property Maintenance Code, shall be deemed a Founded Call for Service, and all costs associated with the call shall be charged to the Property Owner pursuant to Section 22A.08.
  - 2. A second "no show" trip charge has been imposed in accordance with Chapter 29 Housing Code of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - The City mows the property two or more times in a calendar year for an owner in violation of Chapter 21 and/or Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code:
  - 4. The City removes snow from the sidewalk two or more times in a six month period for an owner in violation of Chapter 9 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - The City removes junk, debris, and/or solid waste from the property two or more times in a twelve month period for an owner in violation of Chapter 22 and/or Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code;
  - 6. A violation of Chapter 29 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code(s) is prosecuted in Court and the Court rules in favor of the City;
  - 7. A violation of Cedar Rapids Municipal Code Chapter 22 is prosecuted in Court and the Court rules in favor of the City.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Chapter 22A shall not apply to Calls for Service made by or on behalf of an individual in need of Emergency Assistance, provided the caller(s) has (have) a good faith belief in the need for Emergency Assistance and provided, further, such Emergency Assistance is in fact necessary to prevent or stop further damage to person or property.

Except where otherwise specified, the references in this Section 22A.03 to provisions of the lowa Code or the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code shall not be construed to mean that prosecution of the specific charge is required to proceed under this Chapter, nor shall it be construed to mean the Nuisance Activity must be proven beyond a reasonable doubt. Rather, in determining whether a Property is a Nuisance Property, the Nuisance Property Abatement Coordinator shall apply the criteria of this section using a preponderance of evidence as the standard of proof. Any determination pursuant to this section shall be subject to administrative appeal and/or Court review as set forth in this Chapter.

### 22.04 - PROHIBITIONS.

The following are hereby prohibited by this Chapter:

- a. The creation or maintenance of or the failure to Abate a Nuisance Property.
- b. Interference, delay or hindrance of enforcement of this Chapter except to pursue appeal and/or review of administrative actions by the City Manager or NPAC.
- c. The termination of a lease agreement with a tenant or other retaliation against a

- tenant because that tenant notified or otherwise complained to law enforcement or other city officials that Nuisance Activity was occurring at the Property.
- d. The termination of a lease agreement with a tenant or other retaliation against a tenant because the tenant called for Emergency Assistance for themselves or on behalf of a person in need of Emergency Assistance.

#### 22A.05 - INSPECTION OF PREMISES.

The City Manager is authorized to enter and remain upon private property to the extent reasonably necessary for the purpose of locating, identifying, investigating and documenting any Nuisance Activity as defined by this Chapter and, further, for the purpose of administering this Chapter, subject in any event to the limitations on that authority under other applicable law.

### 22A.06 - FINDING OF VIOLATION; NUISANCE PROPERTY ABATEMENT PLAN.

- a. Upon a threshold determination by the NPAC that a Property meets the criteria of Section 22A.03 herein, the City shall cause a Notice of Violation to be served upon the Property Owner in the manner provided by this Chapter. A courtesy copy of the Notice of Violation shall also be sent by regular mail to the occupant(s) of the Property in question at the address of the Property in question.
- b. Upon the issuance of a Notice of Violation, the Property Owner may submit a Nuisance Property Abatement Plan specifying the Corrective Action the Property Owner will take, including dates by which each Corrective Action shall be completed.
- c. The NPAC shall meet with any Property Owner who has submitted a Nuisance Property Abatement Plan to review the facts of the case and Corrective Action contemplated by the Plan.
- d. The submission of a Nuisance Property Abatement Plan may be the basis for the NPAC, pursuant to Section 22A.07, to postpone by 15 days the imposition of charges otherwise due under Section 22A.08.

### 22A.07 - NOTICE OF VIOLATION; CONTENTS.

The Notice of Violation required by this Chapter shall contain:

- a. The location of the Nuisance Property in question;
- b. A description of what constitutes the violation of this Chapter;
- c. A statement that within 15 days following service of the Notice of Violation, the Property Owner shall be charged for future Founded Calls for Service to the Nuisance Property; provided, however, that if the Property Owner submits a Nuisance Property Abatement Plan, then the NPAC may postpone by 15 days the date that Founded Calls for Service will be billed to the Property Owner.
- d. A statement that pursuant to Section 22A.11 of this Chapter, an aggrieved party may seek administrative appeal of the NPAC's determinations that the Property is a Nuisance Property and the Notice of Violation and/or Court review as authorized by Iowa law.

### 22A.08 - FOUNDED CALLS FOR SERVICE CHARGED TO NUISANCE PROPERTY.

With respect to a Property for which a Notice of Violation has been duly served, the NPAC shall cause to be charged to the Property Owner all costs associated with Founded Calls for Service to the Property, beginning on the date specified in the Notice of Violation

and continuing thereafter until the expiration of one year from the date on the Notice of Violation. This provision shall not be construed so as to preclude an additional determination under Section 22A.03 that the Property is a Nuisance Property due to additional Nuisance Activity. In the event of such an additional finding under Section 22A.03, the twelve month period shall run from date of the most recent Notice of Violation.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the charges otherwise due under this section may be postponed by the NPAC in accordance with 22A.06(d) and 22A.07(c).

#### 22A.09 – EMERGENCY ABATEMENT.

If it is determined by the City Manager that an emergency exists by reason of the continuing presence or repeated occurrence of Nuisance Activity, the City may perform any action required under this Chapter to the extent reasonably necessary to Abate the Nuisance Activity constituting the emergency. This provision shall not be construed so as to impose any duty upon the City to take such action. Emergency action pursuant to this section may be taken without prior notice or hearing. Notice of emergency action shall be provided to the Property Owner, along with an opportunity for hearing as provided in this Chapter. Subject to the provisions of this Chapter concerning Appeals of Administrative Actions or Decisions, if the amount shown by the statement has not been paid by the person within thirty days, it shall then be collected with, and in the same manner, as special taxes.

### 22A.10 - CORRECTIVE ACTION BY THE CITY; COLLECTION OF COSTS.

- a. If a Property Owner who has been served with a Notice of Violation fails or refuses to prevent the recurrence of Nuisance Activity, and the City is capable of correcting or eliminating the Nuisance Activity, the City may take such lawful steps as are necessary and proper to Abate the Nuisance Activity upon 30 days' notice to the Property Owner. This provision shall not be construed so as to impose any duty upon the City to take such corrective action. In so doing, the City shall keep an accurate account of the costs incurred in correcting or eliminating the Nuisance Activity. The NPAC shall keep an itemized account of such costs. The salvage value, if any, of any item or items collected in connection with such action by the City shall be retained by the City and shall be applied as an offset against costs. In the event the salvage proceeds exceed the costs, any such excess shall be paid promptly to the Property Owner.
- b. In the event action is taken pursuant to this section, the NPAC shall mail to the Property Owner an itemized statement of the expenses incurred, minus any salvage value, to the Property Owner demanding payment of the expense. Subject to the provisions of this Chapter concerning Appeals of Administrative Actions or Decisions, if the amount shown by the statement has not been paid by the person within thirty days, it shall then be collected with, and in the same manner, as special taxes.

#### 22A.11 – APPEALS OF ADMINISTRATIVE DECISIONS OR ACTIONS.

- a. Any person aggrieved by a decision or act of the City Manager or NPAC shall have the opportunity for hearing before a duly appointed hearing officer. Any aggrieved party may submit a request for a hearing which shall be in writing delivered to the NPAC. If said request is received within the time stated in the notice of the action or decision in question, the hearing shall be held pursuant to this section; any request for hearing received thereafter shall not entitle the requesting party to a hearing.
- b. Upon receipt of a timely request for hearing, the NPAC shall set a hearing to be held within 30 days from said receipt and, further, shall give at least 10 days' Notice to the requesting party of the time, date and location of said hearing. The hearing may be reset by agreement of the requesting party, the City and the hearing officer, as

confirmed in writing, but in no event shall the hearing be held any later than 60 days after the date of the action or decision being appealed.

- c. At the time of hearing, the requesting party and NPAC shall be afforded the opportunity to present evidence and arguments. The formal rules of evidence and procedure shall not apply. Legal counsel shall not be required but shall be permitted.
- d. Within thirty days after the conclusion of an administrative hearing held pursuant to this section, the hearing officer shall make the following written findings which shall be based on a preponderance of the evidence as the standard of proof, and the City shall serve Notice thereof upon the appealing party:
  - i. Whether the determination under 22A.03 was correct; and
  - ii. Whether the action taken upon that determination was in accordance with all applicable law.
- e. Any decision rendered by a hearing officer pursuant to this section shall be subject to further review by a Court in accordance with Iowa law.
- f. Where a person aggrieved by an action taken pursuant to this Chapter has made a request for an administrative hearing pursuant to this section or has sought further review by a Court as provided by lowa law, any charges for calls for service and any other administrative fees imposed pursuant to this Chapter shall be recorded, but the due date therefor and collection thereof shall be suspended pending the final outcome of any administrative hearing and/or Court review.

### 22A.12 - ALTERNATIVE MEANS OF ENFORCEMENT.

Without negating, restricting or otherwise limiting any conditions or sanctions imposed pursuant to this Chapter, this Chapter may also be enforced by any lawful means including but not limited to the following:

- a. Prosecution as a simple misdemeanor in accordance with Chapter 1 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and Chapter 364 of the Iowa Code.
- b. The filing of a Municipal Infraction in accordance with Chapter 1 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and Chapter 364 of the Iowa Code.

#### 22A.13 - SERVICE OF NOTICE.

Except where expressly provided otherwise, notices required under this Chapter shall be served by one or more of the following methods:

- 1) Mailing by both regular mail and certified mail, as defined in Iowa Code Section 618.15 (2015), to the last known address of the Property Owner;
- 2) Hand delivery to the Property Owner:
- 3) Personal service on the Property Owner pursuant to Iowa Rule of Civil Procedure 1.305; or
- 4) Any other method of providing notice which results in the notice actually being received by the Property Owner.

Notice served by mail under this section is deemed completed ten business days after the notice is deposited in the mail and postmarked for delivery, whether or not the recipient signs a receipt for the notice.

**Background**: This project proposes to construct the section of 26<sup>th</sup> Street SW from 76<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 60<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The current roadway has a rural section with granular surfacing and grassed ditches for channeling stormwater runoff, and the proposed section will be Portland Cement Concrete with an integral curb and storm sewer. #### Background:

Staff will present the findings of the Highway 30 Area Study, completed by the Corridor MPO with participation by the City of Cedar Rapid and Linn County. This study looked at the effects of future development along the corridor. On December 3, 2015 the City Planning Commission recommended that City Council adopt a resolution that would accept the findings of the Highway 30 Area Study. This study was presented to the City Council's Development Committee on November 18, 2015. The Development Committee recommended that the study be sent to the City Planning Commission for review and recommendation prior to going before the full City Council.

It is important to note that the Highway 30 Area Study is not a plan; it is a technical evaluation of growth scenarios in the area. Acceptance of the study does not place a moratorium on development along the corridor, but does affirm the City's already adopted Future Land Use Plan (which can be viewed at the following link: <a href="http://crgis.cedar-rapids.org/FLUM/index.html">http://crgis.cedar-rapids.org/FLUM/index.html</a>

City Council may use the info in the study when considering approval of any annexation and rezoning, as well as the funding for any necessary capital improvements along the corridor in the future..

#### **Study Overview:**

Due to recent request for development in the Highway 30 study area and concerns regarding the availability and provision of services, the City of Cedar Rapids submitted a request to the Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization for the development of a Highway 30 study. In March 2015, the Corridor MPO Policy Board approved executing a contract with HR Green and teaming partner SB Friedman for the project. The study area shown in Figure 1 includes portions of the City of Cedar Rapids and unincorporated Linn County. The study is a technical analysis of the multiple impacts from land development, and includes an associated fiscal impact assessment. It is not a plan. More specifically, the study examines the following in the context of two growth scenarios:

- Determine how the study area would be served with municipal transportation, water, sanitary sewer, and stormwater maintenance;
- Identify environmental impacts to the area based on available information; and
- Complete a fiscal impact analysis for each development scenario to determine if each development scenario is sustainable.

Two growth scenarios were developed as part of the study. Scenario 1, planned growth, depicts development that is consistent with growth allowed by the City of Cedar Rapids and Linn County comprehensive plans. Scenario 2, market-driven growth, depicts a combination of growth allowed by the comprehensive plans, development that aligns with existing development, and recent development proposals.

As part of the development of the study, the MPO convened a task force that included representatives from the City of Cedar Rapids, City of Ely, Linn County, and the Iowa Department of Transportation. Representatives from these member jurisdictions, as well as the Iowa DOT, had the opportunity to comment and provide input on the study throughout the process. The study will serve as a resource to member jurisdictions; it supports the policy direction of both the City of Cedar Rapids and Linn County's comprehensive plans.

In April 2015, the MPO staff commenced work with the consultants on the development of the study. Since that time, a task force consisting of staff from the cities of Cedar Rapids, Ely, Linn County, and Iowa DOT met five times to provide feedback throughout the process. In addition, the consultant conducted one-on-one meetings with key staff from the member jurisdictions who specialize in planning, utilities, transportation, public safety, and finance. In order to obtain some qualitative input, two focus groups sessions were conducted, which included representatives of environmental organizations and land owners, business, and residents of the study area.

#### **Key Findings**

The study outlines the following key findings:

- 1. Revenue generated from development with either Scenario does not cover the costs associated with providing City infrastructure and services.
- 2. Infrastructure improvements needed to support growth in the Study Area are significant.
- 3. Concerns exist related to safety along the Highway 30 corridor.
- 4. Impacts to contiguous forested areas, as well as prime agricultural resources, should be avoided, at a minimum, mitigated.
- 5. The capital costs associated with Scenario 2 are over double that of Scenario 1.
- 6. Compared with Scenario 1, Scenario 2 would take over 3 times as long to pay off the municipal share of capital costs.

#### Relationship to EnvisionCR

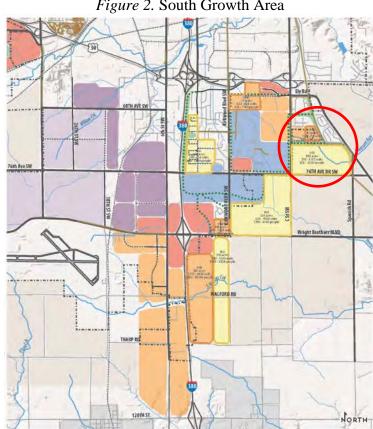


Figure 2. South Growth Area

The City's comprehensive plan, EnvisionCR, is the guiding policy document for growth and development in the city. It promotes infill development within the city's core neighbors where there are existing services and infrastructure. In addition, recognizing that the city will grow, the plan identifies growth areas. The South Growth Area includes a very small portion of the Highway 30 study area. Specifically, the portion south of Highway 30, west of Ely Road, and north of Wright Brother Blvd (see Figure 2).

For a variety of reasons, including topography, agricultural resources, environmentally sensitive lands, as well as issues with providing infrastructure and service, the plan does not identify the remainder of the study area as a growth area. Therefore, the results of the Highway 30 Area Study support the policy direction of the plan.

**EnvisionCR Element/Goal:** StrengthenCR Goal 2: Improve the quality and identity of neighborhoods and key corridors.

**Background**: This resolution establishes a Design Review Technical Advisory Committee (DRTAC) for the MedQuarter Design Review Overlay District. Applications to serve on the committee will be accepted by the City Clerk's office with appointments made at a future date.

On May 12, 2015 the City Council approved Ordinance 035-15, which established a Design Review Overlay District within the boundaries of the MedQuarter SSMID. This district establishes enhanced design guidelines for development, encouraging high quality urban infill development. City Code provides for the establishment of a committee, named the Design Review Technical Advisory Committee, to review applications in each established design review district. The purpose of the committee is to meet with applicants and provide comments related to building permits and land development applications.

The DRTAC does not have the ability to approve or deny applications, but can pass comments on to the approval body. For building permit applications the DRTAC functions to facilitate discussion between applicants and stakeholders within the district. For major land development cases approved by City Planning Commission or the City Council, the DRTAC functions to both offer comments to the applicant and advise the approving body.

The purpose of this resolution is to formally set the role and membership for the MedQuarter DRTAC. Staff worked with the MedQuarter SSMID Standards Committee and Executive Director to discuss options for the board. Because of the unique circumstances of the MedQuarter Design Review Overlay District having the same boundaries as the MedQuarter SSMID, it is expected the committee will work closely with the District. The MedQuarter DRTAC is recommended to have 5 members with a direct interest in the MedQuarter District. It is recommended that at least one member of the DRTAC be a design professional such as an architect. The remaining members should represent a variety of interests, such as landowners, business interests, non-profit organizations or be residents of the district.

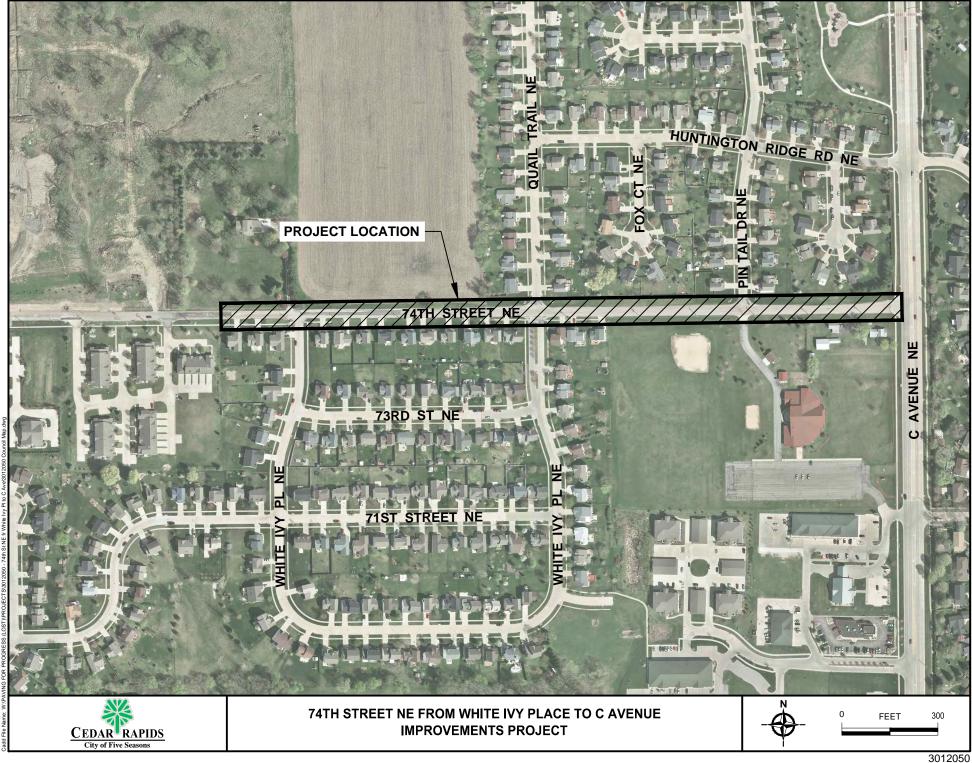

In addition, the Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization (CMPO) has approved \$2,033,000 of federal-aid funding for the C Avenue NE from Collins Road to Blairs Ferry Road Improvements project and the City Council approved Agreement No. 6-08-STPU-10, Federal Aid Agreement for Surface Transportation Program for this project on May 14, 2008.

Rockwell Collins, Inc. requested that the roadway improvements on C Avenue NE adjacent to their property be modified to conceptually fit with the aesthetics of their corporate campus, address their employee safety issues for crossing C Avenue NE, and to address the safety issues for ingress and egress to their property. In addition, Rockwell Collins, Inc. requested to substitute a traffic signal at the location of the existing pedestrian actuated warning flasher located on C Avenue NE between Collins Road and Blairs Ferry Road as a substitute public improvement for a pedestrian undercrossing of C Avenue NE. The City Council approved an Agreement with Rockwell Collins, Inc. on April 8, 2014 that defined the project improvements, access modifications, and financing of project improvements.

Project improvements include two northbound and two southbound through traffic lanes, left turn lanes at three Rockwell entrances, maintain the existing left turn lanes at Collins Road and Blaris Ferry Road, right turn lanes at three Rockwell entrances and Blairs Ferry Road, and a 42 ft. landscaped median. Rockwell Collins, Inc. will install and maintain the landscaped median through a separate Agreement with the City.

Contract No. 301612-03 completed construction of the trunk storm sewer improvements and cathodic protection for the 24 inch transmission water main in the summer of 2015. Subject to receipt of acceptable bids, construction is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2016 and be completed in the fall of 2016.

#### Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends approval of the Motion filing plans, specifications, form of contract, estimated costs, setting a public hearing date for January 12, 2016 and publishing notice of public hearing for the project.

#### **Alternative Recommendation:**

The Council could defer approval. However, this action would postpone the bid date, which would affect construction schedule, and require removal of the project from the lowa DOT bid schedule.

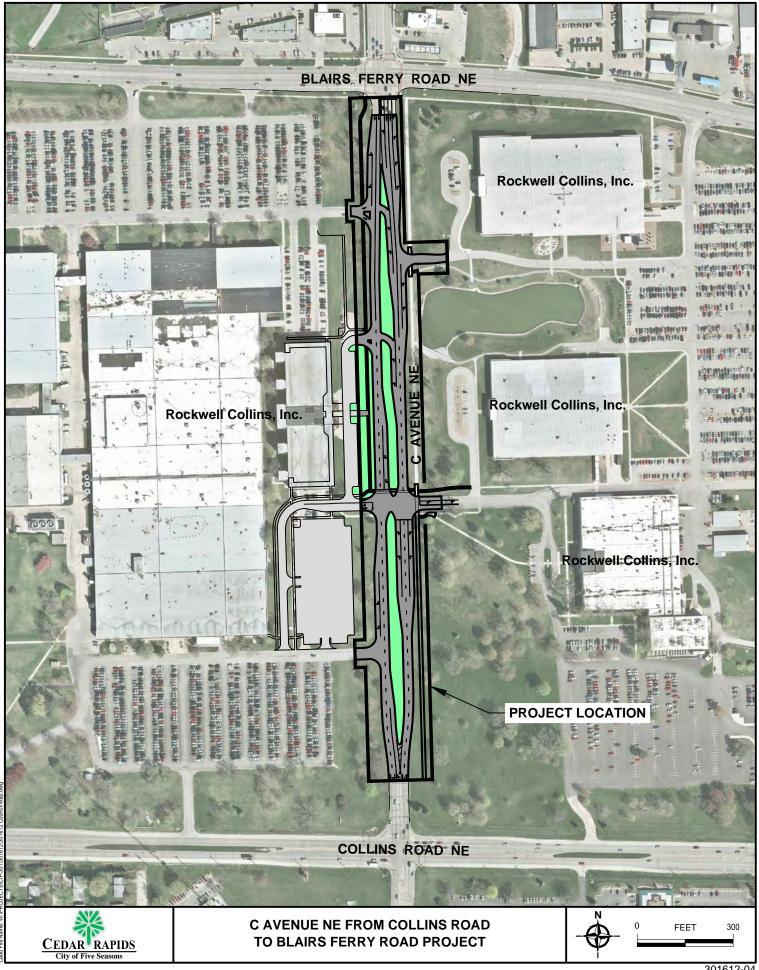

#### Background:

The Utilities Department – Water Division is responsible for the billing and collection of municipal utility bills for water, sewer, storm sewer, solid waste and recycling services provided to our customers. The Utilities Department – Water Division initiates the Special Assessment process whenever delinquent utility balances are unpaid; collection efforts have been ignored; and active services have been terminated. After Council approves the Intent to Assess resolution, a Notice of Intent to Assess letter is mailed to the customer at least 30 days prior to this Special Assessment.

Below are the steps taken in typical situations:

- Friendly Reminder is mailed
- Final Notice is mailed
- Door Tag is placed at premise
- Services are terminated.
- A Notice of Intent to Assess letter is mailed to the customer
- Special Assessment is approved by the City Council at least thirty days after the Intent to Assess letter is mailed

The Notice of Intent to Assess the properties was approved by City Council Resolution No. 1540-11-15 on November 3, 2015.

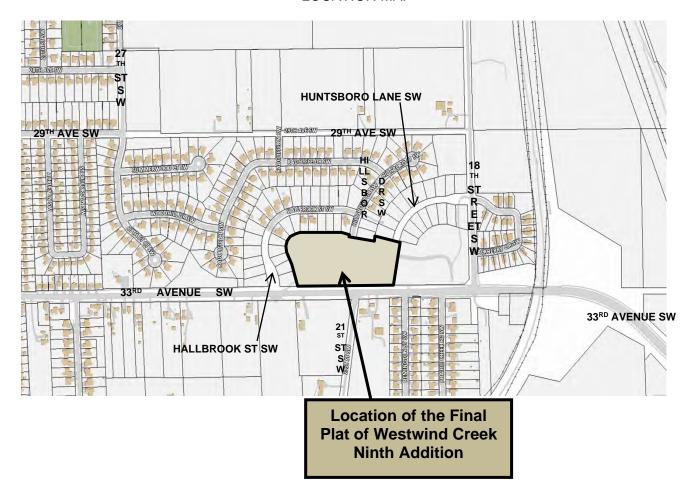

#### Background:

The City has received a request from Terex Corporation to extend the City's reimbursement of increased taxes (TIF) at the Fountains development up to \$506,000 to retain Terex's 50 jobs with average annual salary of \$60,000 in Cedar Rapids.

The City received a letter from Terex indicating the company intends to relocate from its current facility to office space based on current and future needs. With the assistance of the Metro Economic Alliance staff, Terex evaluated existing office space within Cedar Rapids, including in downtown, and multiple sites outside of Cedar Rapids.

Two sites remain in play are the Fountains development and the Berthel Fisher building in Marion, which comes fully furnished. The \$506,000 in incentive is being requested to offset furnishing and additional tenant build out for the Fountain's office space necessary to meet the space and furnishing requirements of Terex.

The Fountains development approved by City Council is receiving the standard 5-years, 100% reimbursement of increased taxes for each separately assessed building. The additional incentive request can be satisfied by extending the reimbursement of increased taxes on this specific building beginning in year 6. Staff estimates, subject to actual property valuation, the incentive would be satisfied in 1.5 to 3 years beyond the approved 5-years. The increase in taxes from other buildings in the Fountains development would not be impacted.

Staff recommends approval of the additional \$506,000 in financial assistance conditioned on the following:

- Signed 10-year lease agreement between the Fountains, LLC and Terex;
- Development Agreement memorializing the following terms:
  - Repayment of the incentive in the event Terex breaks the lease prior to the 10year term;
  - o Employment commitment thresholds for Terex;
  - o Commitment to begin construction of the second office building in 2015.

As a member of local management of Terex Corporation located in Cedar Rapids, I have been working with our local team to relocate to a newer, more condensed facility to better meet our current and future needs. We currently have approximately 50 team members in our local office with an average wage of over \$60,000.

A team member site search committee was compiled to research all available properties within the Cedar Rapids metro area. This committee has been working closely with Brian Crowe from the Cedar Rapids Metro Economic Alliance. Brian was a great help to us and assisted our committee in finding five properties in the metro area to review. Our search committee researched and toured these properties. Between layout, price, appeal and other factors, they narrowed the search to two final selections. One is the soon to be "old" Berthel Fisher building on Tama Street in Marion and the other is in the new "Fountains" complex off Edgewood Road in Cedar Rapids.

We have worked diligently with representatives of both properties on office layout, lease cost, new office furniture cost, parking, local amenities and various other factors. Though both properties are very appealing to us, our initial decision was made to pursue the Tama Street building in Marion. We decided this because the Marion location came furnished and turn-key ready other than minor modifications.

Upon understanding our decision, the Fountains team worked with the City of Cedar Rapids to revise their proposal. Though the usable sq ft is slightly smaller than the Marion property, the new layout meets our needs and the revised lease cost, now including new furniture, allowed us to reevaluate our decision and ultimately choose to stay within the Cedar Rapids city limits and lease the Fountains property.

#### Background:

The City received a petition requesting creation of a Self-Supporting Medical Improvement District (SSMID) on August 24, 2015 signed by property owners in the proposed Czech Village-New Bohemia SSMID area (see attached map).

The purpose of the proposed Czech Village-New Bohemia Self Supported Municipal Improvement District, as set forth in the petition filed with the City Clerk on August 24, will be the undertaking of actions intended to benefit the property within the District. The activities will include:

- Economic Development
- Communications and Advocacy
- Capital Improvements
- Enhanced Maintenance
- Parking Management

The Iowa Code requires that a petition to create or expand a SSMID must be made by 25% of the property owners representing at least 25% of the assessed property value in the district. The petition for the creation of the Czech Village-New Bohemia SSMID was signed by owners of 60 of the 104 taxable parcels (57%) representing 62% of the assessed value for the proposed expansion area.

The petition states that if approved, the District will be created for a period of seven (7) years, commencing with a levy of taxes for collection in Fiscal Year 2017. After the seven (7) year period, the District may be renewed following the same petitioning process. Properties within the proposed District boundary area will be taxed \$1 per thousand dollars of taxable value in the first year. During the remaining lifetime of the District, properties within the proposed District

boundary area will be taxed with rates of assessment not to exceed \$3 per thousand dollars of taxable valuation in the next six (6) years. The levy rate of \$3 is the maximum combined rate which may be used for debt service, capital improvements, or operations.

The City of Cedar Planning Commission reviewed the request and unanimously supported the SSMID on September 10, 2015. As such, the CPC recommends approval to City Council (CPC Resolution of Support attached). The steps in the process include the following:

#### ORDINANCE NO. LEG NUM TAG

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE CZECH VILLAGE-NEW BOHEMIA SELF-SUPPORTED MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 386, CODE OF IOWA; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FUNDS AND THE LEVY OF ANNUAL TAXES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the City of Cedar Rapids, in the County of Linn, State of Iowa, is authorized by Chapter 386, Code of Iowa (the "Act"), to create a self-supported municipal improvement district, as defined in the Act, in the City, to provide for the existence and operation of such district, to provide for improvements or self-liquidating improvements, as defined in the Act, for such district, to authorize and issue bonds for the purposes of such district and to levy such taxes as are authorized by the Act with respect to such district; and

WHEREAS, there was filed with the City Clerk on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2015, a petition petitioning the City Council to establish a self-supported municipal improvement district (the "proposed District") in accordance with the Act, to establish an operation fund, a capital improvement fund and a debt service fund with respect to the Proposed District and in accordance with the Act and to levy an annual tax for each of such funds in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, the petition is in all ways in complete compliance with the provisions of the Act; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of such petition, the City Planning Commission did review the merits and feasibility of the petition and recommended the establishment of the district to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has filed with the City Council such evaluative report on the merits and feasibility of the project proposed in the petition, all in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the filing of the aforementioned report, the Council did set the 20th day of October, 2015, at 4:00pm, at the Council Chamber, City Hall, in the City, as the time and place for a meeting at which it proposed to take action for the establishment of the Proposed District and did in accordance with the Act publish notice of such meeting as provided in Section 362.3 of the Code of Iowa, and the Clerk did mail written notice of such meeting to each owner of property within the Proposed District, which notice was mailed to such property owners by certified mail not less than fifteen days before such meeting; and

WHEREAS, at the aforementioned time and place, the Council did meet and hear owners of property in the Proposed District and residents of the City desiring to express their views with respect to the establishment of the Proposed District; and

WHEREAS, no petition has been filed with the City Clerk containing the signatures of at least 40 percent of all owners of property within the Proposed District or signatures which together represent ownership of property with an assessed value of 40 percent or more of the

assessed value of all property within the Proposed District seeking to have the entire matter of establishing the Proposed District withdrawn from Council consideration; and

WHEREAS, more than thirty days have passed since the holding of the public hearing referred to above and the Council may now proceed with the establishment of a self-supported municipal improvement district in accordance with the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained and Enacted by the Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, State of Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be and there is hereby created in the City a self-supported municipal improvement district, as defined in the Act, the name of which shall be the Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District (sometimes hereinafter referred to as the "District"), the purposes of which District are the undertaking of actions and the design and construction of any and all "improvements" and "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act and the performance of administration, redevelopment and revitalization of the District, as authorized by the Act.

Section 2. The District shall include all property within the boundaries described in Exhibit A and mapped in Exhibit B.

Section 3. It is hereby found and determined that the owners of all of the property within the District have a present and potential benefit from the condition, development and maintenance of the District and that all of the property within the District is related by virtue of its location and use so as to be benefited by the condition, development and maintenance of the District or is otherwise related in some manner such that inclusion in the District meets the requirements of the Act.

Section 4. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, there is hereby established and created a self-supported improvement district operation fund, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Operation Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Operation Fund"), for which Operation Fund the City may certify taxes (the "Operation Tax") against the property, as defined in the Act (excluding property assessed as residential property for property tax purposes), within the District (the "Property") each year, in addition to all other taxes, commencing with the levy of taxes for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and continuing for 6 additional years, for the purpose of paying such expenses of the District as are authorized by the Act, including, but not limited to, the administrative expenses of the District and part or all of the maintenance expenses of the District, and part or all of the maintenance expenses of "improvements" or "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act, for a period of 7 years.

Section 5. The Operation Tax, as provided in Section 5 hereof, shall be levied annually upon the Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 6. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, there is hereby established and created a capital improvement fund for such District, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Capital Improvement Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Capital Improvement Fund"), for which Capital Improvement Fund the City may certify taxes (the "Capital Improvement Fund Tax") each year, commencing with the levy of taxes for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and continuing for 6 additional years, to be levied against all of the Property in the District, in addition to all other

taxes, for the purpose of accumulating moneys for the financing or payment of a part or all of the cost of any "improvements" or "self-liquidating improvements", as defined in the Act.

Section 7. The Capital Improvement fund Tax, as provided in Section 7 hereof, shall be levied annually upon the Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 8. Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, whenever any self-supported municipal improvement district bonds, as defined in the Act, are issued and outstanding with respect to the District, other than revenue bonds, the City shall establish, create and maintain a self-supported municipal improvement district debt service fund for such District, which shall be known as the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Debt Service Fund" (and is hereinafter referred to as the "Debt Service Fund"), and shall certify taxes (the "Debt Service Fund Tax") each year to be levied against all of the Property in the District in an amount necessary to pay interest as it becomes due and to pay, or to create a sinking fund to pay, principal at maturity of all self-supported municipal improvement district bonds, as defined in the Act.

Section 9. The Debt Service Fund Tax, as provided in Section 9 hereof, shall be levied annually upon Property at a rate not to exceed Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 10. The combined rate of the Operation Tax, the Capital Improvement Fund Tax and the Debt Service Fund Tax to be levied annually, in addition to all other taxes, as aforesaid shall not exceed a rate of Three Dollars (\$3.00) per thousand dollars of taxable value of the Property.

Section 11. There is hereby created the "Czech Village-New Bohemia Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District Commission." (Hereinafter referred to as "the Commission"). The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. The current Czech Village-New Bohemia District Steering Committee shall recommend members to be appointed to the Commission and file a list of such candidates with the City Clerk within sixty (60) days of the publication of this ordinance.

Section 12. The Commission shall perform those duties and functions associated with the operation, supervision, maintenance and management of the district. The Commission may make rules and regulations as necessary and appropriate relating to the management and operation of the District.

Section 13. The Commission shall file with the City Clerk an annual budget for consideration and approval by the City Council. The annual budget shall contain at a minimum, the sources of funds, uses of funds, and how those uses are related to the stated goals of the District. The Commission shall be authorized and to otherwise raise funds by solicitation and contributions. All monies of the District shall be maintained in one or more special funds in the City Treasurer's office with expenditures from said funds to be made by the approval by the City Council. In addition, the Commission shall have authority to expend such funds as may be authorized by the City Council.

Section 14. From and after the effective date of this ordinance the City Clerk shall cause a copy of this ordinance to be filed in the office of the County Recorder of Linn County.

Section 15. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed insofar as the conflicting portions thereof are concerned.

Section 16. The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence, or provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of this ordinance, which can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

Section 17. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect with its passage and publication, according to the laws of the State of Iowa.

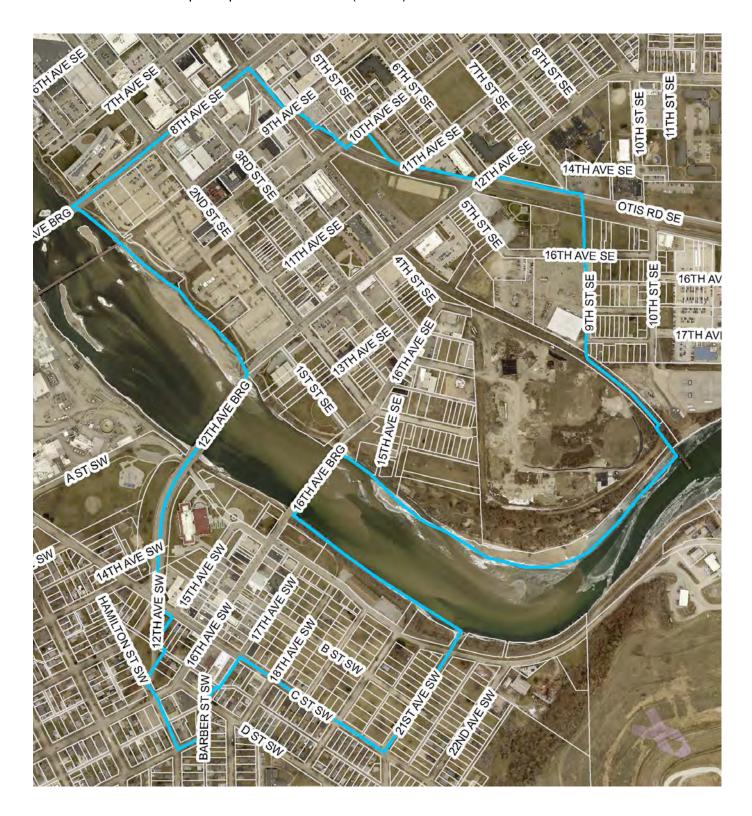
